



Hints from Heloise

Mocha smoothie new recipe twist

Dear Heloise: I read your article and saw your MOCHA COFFEE recipe. I have gotten your pamphlet and love the different recipes, and have given them as gifts. My daughter and her family have added a new twist to the mocha coffee. They make the recipe, leaving out the powdered creamer and using a cup of low-fat milk, adding ice cubes and blending it. She has told me that it makes the most fantastic smoothie. Hope your readers will try and enjoy. - Kay Hansen, Bill-

Kay, how nice of you to write about this delicious, tasty and cheap-to-make mocha coffee recipe. For readers who want to taste it, here it is:

1/2 cup instant-coffee granules 1/2 cup granulated sugar (or appropriate

amount of artificial sweetener)

1 cup powdered milk or powdered creamer (nonfat creamer can be substituted*)

2 tablespoons (or more) cocoa powder

Mix the ingredients together. For a cup of mocha coffee, just put 2 rounded teaspoons (less if using artificial sweetener) of the flavored blend into an 8-ounce cup and add boiling water, stir-

*Note: Some nonfat creamers have sugar included, so you might need to adjust the sugar amount. Want to try cheap-to-make spiced, orange or chocolate extract coffee? MAKING SOUP

Dear Heloise: I regularly make big pots of soup. I use a big pot with a metal colander insert to put chicken or turkey carcasses or bones in. When the stock is ready, I just take out the colander (using hot pads - Heloise) with all the bones in it, avoiding any getting into the broth. Then I set the pot in the fridge overnight so the fat hardens on the top and can easily be scooped off. Then it's all prepared to add veggies, seasonings and noodles or rice. -- Jean Milici, Torrington, Conn.

COOKING-OIL POURING



Seek and Ye Shall Find

In some notrump contracts, declarer cannot afford to establish his long suit because by the time he does so, the opponents will have collected enough tricks to set him. In such situations, declarer must look elsewhere for the tricks he needs to get home safely.

Take this case where West leads a heart against three notrump. South wins with the queen and can count eight sure winners -- two spades, two hearts and four clubs. Understandably, his natural impulse is to try to establish the diamond suit. But if he gives in to this temptation, he is headed for certain defeat, since by the time the A-K of diamonds are driven out, the defenders will have scored at least three heart tricks and two diamond tricks.

South must therefore find his ninth trick elsewhere. The only remaining source is in spades, where a simple finesse against the queen is available. If West was dealt the queen -- an even-money shot -- finessing the jack will succeed, and declarer's troubles will be over.

However, while this line of play raises South's chances from zero to 50 percent, it is still not the best approach. An even better plan, which improves his chances to 75 percent, is to lead the nine of spades at trick two and let it ride if West follows low. In the actual deal, the nine forces East's queen,

so the jack of spades becomes declarer's ninth trick. (If West covers the nine with the ten, dummy's jack is played, and the eight becomes the ninth trick.) If the nine happens to lose to the ten, South can finesse the jack next time. This line of play succeeds whenever West was

dealt either the ten or queen of spades, or both. Mathematically, the odds are about 3-to-1 that West has at least one of these cards. All South need do at the outset is to recognize the value of the 9-8 of spades.
