These areas offer hunting opportunities for a variety of animals including turkey, deer, pheasants, upland birds, waterfowl, bobcat and even prairie dogs.

Thomas, Logan, Rawlins, Cheyenne and Sherman County all have several controlled shooting areas where people can hunt.

Thomas County visitors and citizens can come hunt Melvin J. Eberle's property in Oakley.

Eberle said people can hunt for quail and pheasant at his lodge. The cost to hunt is about \$150 per person, Eberle said. People can hunt for a full day or a half a day on his property. He said he has a little lodge that people could stay in if they want. But if people decided to stay overnight it would cost them more money, he said. Oakley that they allow people to hunt on. People can hunt pheasant, chuckers and quail at the hunting area, Michael said. The price to hunt in the area is \$200 per day. Hunters can take 16 pheasants or 20 chuckers and 32 quails, Shad said. He said he has been raising pheasants for 8 or 9 years.

the area now known as Fike Park would fill up with water and transform into a lake. The locals dubbed it Carp Lake. While the area was dry for much of the year, when it was full of water the townspeople would go boating on the lake. Unfortunately for the boaters, the lake didn't always smell very good. When the area was dry it was used as a dumping ground for manure that came from the livery stables in town, said Taylor. An article in the Colby Free Press in the early 1900's reported that lovers continued to go boating in the lake in spite of the smell.
