In our region, northwest Kansas raked in a total of \$411.1 million in tourism spending, with the bulk of those dollars being spent in Hays, Colby and Goodland, in that order, on accommodations, food and shopping.

We will be holding a luncheon for our volunteers from the Colby Visitor Center, who spend many hours welcoming people to Colby. We celebrate these volunteers, who are under the leadership of staff manager Ralph Fischer. Community leaders will help the Convention and Visitor Bureau board honor our volunteers at the May 13 event.




