College seeks replacement for men's basketball coach

Colby Community College is is looking for for men's basketball coach after the college board voted 4-1 last month to terminate the contract of John Woods, and also needs a new men's cross country coach.

"We've had some coaches contact us about applying for the (basketball) job," said Deb Schwanke, public information director at the college.

At a special meeting April 20, the board gave five reasons not to to renew Woods' contract, saying he had:

- Been ineffective as leader of
- Failed to achieve success in the basketball program, as evidenced by his win-loss record.

• Been unable to foster a good work environment with his assis-

• Failed to honor a commitment to the board last year that he would resign if he couldn't achieve suc-

President Lynn Kreider said that at a meeting last March, Woods told the board, "If I can't win, it would be time to move on."

At the 2008 meeting Woods said, "I think I've done a good job teaching, but that is one my duties. I have to teach classes. I get to teach basketball.
