Recall notices help ensure kitchen safety

MANHATTAN - Recent food recalls for peanut butter have triggered questions about a popular kitchen staple, a Kansas State University food scientist said.

"A recall is, however, a positive step in the food safety process because it means that our system is working," said Karen Blakeslee, Kansas State University Research and Extension food scientist.

Recall notices should be considered a plus because they can help consumers avoid troublesome foods, said Blakeslee, who, as coordinator for Extension's Rapid Response Center, often answers food and food safety questions.

To help consumers learn more about food recalls, Blakeslee has added a direct link to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Food Safety and Inspection Service listing of current recalls on the K-State Research and Extension food safety Web site at www.ksre. ksu.edu/foodsafety/.


