Dental program has new director

Colby Community College President Dr. Lynn Kreider has named Bobette Maier as director of the Dental Hygiene program.

Maier, who has been a full-time instructor at Colby for three years, teaches and supervises students in the dental hygiene clinic. She will replace Becky Vollertsen, who an- of only three dental hygiene pronounced her retirement effective in May. Vollertsen was the first director of the program, which began in August 1998.

"The dental hygiene program is one of our premiere programs," said Dr. Kreider. "I am pleased that Bobette has accepted this challenge. She has done an excellent job as an instructor, and I am confident she will continue the tradition of excellence in the dental hygiene program."

Maier, a native of Imperial, Neb., graduated from the dental hygienist program at the University of South Dakota. She moved to Colby and worked for Dr. Randy Nordstrom for 17 years. After Dr. Nordstrom retired, she worked for Dr. Karen Thummel for four years prior to accepting the teaching job at the college.

"I became interested in dentistry when I was a junior in high school," said Maier. "I worked with a hygienist in Imperial, and decided I wanted to learn more. teach and assist with labs and the After high school, I earned my clinic. dental assistant degree from Mid-

Students in the dental hygiene program make a big commitment when entering the two-year professional program, she said. In addition to classroom instruction, students participate in weekly labs and clinics to prepare for the national board exam. Colby has one grams in Kansas. The other two are in urban locations - Johnson County Community College and Wichita State University.

"It is a very demanding program," said Maier. "Students must be very organized. I suggest that interested students take as many chemistry and science courses as possible prior to applying for admission. It is also helpful if applicants have observed or worked in a dental practice. The CCC program has a 100 percent placement rate for recent graduates.3

The nationally accredited program is unique in its method of delivery, she said. The classroom component is delivered via interactive television equipment from Northcentral Technical College in Wausau, Wis. Lectures are reinforced with labs and clinics on the Colby campus.
