4. Three clubs. Not only must a game in hearts be reached, but slam possibilities must be explored, and the investigation is inith in clubs (forcing to game).
Your intention is to raise hearts on the next round, thus completing the picture of both your high-card values and distribution. Once partner e his honor cards more accurately and decide
how high to go. If he has the A-K of hearts, or ace of spades and king of hearts, he should make
a move toward slam, while at the same time he should regard any honor cards in spades (other han the ace) as practically worthless.
