Special greenhouse a pleasant surprise

Northwest Kansas and Eastern Colorado are fortunate to have access to a number of great greenhouses and garden centers.

The offerings of quality-grown garden plants and garden accessories are most helpful to the gardening public, not to mention the staffs' outstanding knowledge about the things they offer.

Greenhouses and garden centers serve an important service to the gardeners of the area, particularly this time of the year as we plant seeds and transplant all kinds of growing things in our gardens.

One of the best kept secrets regarding the services of greenhouses and garden centers is a facility called the Glade Greenhouse. It's in Glade, in Phillips County, about four or five miles south of Phillipsburg on U.S. 183, population about 105. The greenhouse is owned and operated by Gerald Ratliff and his wife Patsy.

They have been operating it since the middle 90s, when they bought it from Norm Leidig, who built the greenhouse several years before. Gerald had worked for Norm for a couple of years when Norm announced one day to Gerald that "you are going to buy this place." Which of course, the Ratliffs did.

The Glade Greenhouse offers just about anything you could possible want in the way of plant life and so much more. Just east of the greenhouse is nearly a half a block of garden statuary. Most of the things in the hugh display were made by the Ratliff family

You can buy just about every animal, in just about any size, that you could possibly want. Some of the figures, all made from concrete, weigh as much as 600 pounds. Gerald has close to 700 different molds of the statuary he makes right there at the greenhouse. There are hundreds of garden statues available, and people come from far and wide to stroll through the "concrete jungle" of animals and birds.

Lets fact it. The Glade Greenhouse is a throwback to most of the facilities located in the city. There is no glass in the buildings and most of the plants they sell are grown especially for them by other facilities in Kansas. But just about every vegetable and flower is available there.

In a recent visit, I noticed that they even had copies of my book "The Gardener's Common-Sense Guide to Vegetable Gardening in the Midwest," available right there on the counter. I was glad to hear that sales are brisk for it, just like about everything else at this unique greenhouse and garden center. If you happen to find yourself anywhere near Glade, make sure you pay a visit to the greenhouse. It's not hard to find.


