

Swine flu cases increase in east Kansas



mouth with a tissue when coughing or sneezing and throwing the tissue away after using it, following public health advice and and finding healthy ways to deal with stress and anxiety.

William Schaffner, chairman of the department of preventive medicine at Vanderbilt University School of Medicine, said people can get swine flu by being within three to six feet of a sick person. He said this usually means when infected persons are close to someone while in a confined space. In order to contract the disease there must be sustained contact between a person with someone who is infected.

The department is also warning parents to remain alert for possible virus transmission at summer camps, noting that illnesses

that any flu virus can spread more easily in group settings," Eberhart-Phillips said. "If your children show signs of illness, contact your family doctor or a local clinic and keep them home from summer camps, day cares or other group activities."
