



Cream of tartar cleans aluminum

Cleaning Aluminum Pans

Dear Heloise: Thank you for your wonderful hints in The (Harrisburg, Pa.) Patriot-News. I read your hint on how to clean the INTERIOR OF ALUMINUM PANS. I have pans with dark interiors from cooking things such as asparagus, etc., and they need a good cleaning. Please help! - Charlotte McCrary, Hummelstown, Pa.

Thanks for the kind words. The secret to getting those aluminum pans clean again is as close as your spice shelf. Just grab the jar of cream of tartar. Fill the pan with water and add 1 tablespoon of cream of tartar for each quart of water. Bring this to a boil. Let it "cook" for 10 minutes. Pour out the water, let cool, wash and rinse. It might take more than one cream-of-tartar cleaning. - Heloise

EASY COFFEE POURING

Unless you are a buttermilk drinker, you probably don't keep it on hand. There are a couple of

ways to solve this problem: • Mix plain yogurt with whole milk: 3/4 cup of

yogurt with 1/4 cup regular milk. • No yogurt? No problem! Add 1 tablespoon lemon juice or vinegar to 1 cup whole milk. Let it sit for about 10 minutes. It should thicken before being added to the other ingredients. – Heloise

STERLING-SILVER FLATWARE


- Heloise SCOURING-PAD STORAGE

Dear Heloise: I have found a way to keep soapfilled scouring pads from getting rusty. After I use one, I put it in an airtight, sealable plastic bag. It CARTA. will stay fresh for months. - Janice B., Montgomery, Texas

Another way to save on them is to cut them in half or in fourths for use, or pop into a plastic bag or small container after using and into the freezer. They won't rust! – Heloise

Good Detective Work

Let's say you're in six clubs and West leads a heart to East's ace. East then returns the heart queen to your king. How would you continue?

Obviously, your only other possible loser is a diamond. It is equally clear that you can escape a diamond loser by finessing successfully against the queen. The only problem is which way to finesse, since you can do so in either direction.

There are two ways of approaching situations of this type. One is that East, having overcalled on the two-level, is more likely to have the queen; the other is that since East is longer in hearts, West probably has the greater diamond length and is thus more likely to hold the queen.

Both are rules of thumb only, and not too much reliance should be placed on either of them without seeking further enlightenment about how the East-West cards are divided.

Accordingly, at trick three you play a spade to the ace, ruff a spade high, lead a low trump to the eight and ruff another spade high. You then lead a trump to the jack and ruff dummy's last spade.

By now you should feel extremely confident about your prospects, since the East-West hands are more or less an open book. The four rounds of spades you so carefully played have settled the issue beyond a doubt. Your investigation disclosed that East started

with four spades and three clubs, in addition to at least the five hearts he needed for his overcall. He therefore cannot have more than one diamond.

Accordingly, after drawing a third round of trumps, you cash the ace of diamonds and then take a diamond finesse through West with 100 percent assurance that it will win.




