# County recycling inspires region

ment for the e-waste recycle proj-

"In the two-year program," Koon said, "the state will pick up 100 percent of the recycling costs including shipping, for free, for households, governments and schools. However, businesses and organizations have to pay the fees themselves.

"There are only 16 months left of the free program."

Koon said she expects some type of program to continue, but right now it's a good way to let people clean house.

Koon said right now, the program is changing the drop-off fee it charges businesses and groups for electronics from 10 to 20 cents a pound to 25 to 50 cents a pound. She said shipping costs have gone up and the agency had to find a new drop-off point.

She said they have a television sitting in the warehouse ready to move that weighs 346 pounds.

"If we had to charge 55 cents a be nearly \$200," she said, "and who can afford to pay \$200 to get rid of an old TV that doesn't work?"

The e-waste generally goes to Unicor, a program at the U.S. prison in Leavenworth, which has cor was the first permitted facility


"Not every e-waste recycling vendor can take e-waste from the pilot project," Koon said, "because they must have a state permit. There are only three facilities in the state of Kansas with permits. There is a safety factor involved because of safeguarding personal information on a computer. The waste is not allowed to be sent out of state."

In other areas of recycling, aluminum is sent to Wichita. Card-

board and paper products are sent to Hutchinson and Phillipsburg. Glass is sent to McPherson to the fiberglass plant. Koon noted that recycled glass has been used experimentally in road projects and is called "glassphalt," There is a stretch of Interstate between Colby and Salina that appears glittery because of the glass in the construction materials, she said.

"We have brought about a million dollars to Thomas County through grants," Koon said, "and that's how we got the warehouse, the fork lift, and the trailer that is on the road three days a week, picking up recyclables.

"We have got to get in the habit of recycling to save tonnage in the landfill. What we throw away is bad for the environment and is unhealthy."




