Veteran's gun rights subject of House bill

U. S. Rep. Jerry Moran, a senior member of the House Veterans Affairs Committee, has introduced a bill, the Veterans Second Amendment Protection Act, to prevent veterans from being unfairly denied their right to buy firearms.
 The bill would reform a Department of Veterans Affairs process that arbitrarily strips the Second Amendment rights of veterans and their families who receive assistance managing their financial affairs, his office said.
 Under current practice, veterans and other beneficiaries who have a fiduciary appointed to act on their behalf, are deemed "mental-
