When our daughter was in high school, her social studies teacher one year gave the boys in the class extra credit if they registered for the draft. Of course, at that time, girls were excluded. Our daughter was upset at the unfairness of it, and we quite agreed. So she and I

went to talk to the teacher about it, and pointed out the unfairness of it. And his response? "Well life is not fair, is it?" I managed to keep my cool, though it wasn't easy. His response smacked of gross insensitivity as a teacher. My response was that he at least ought to offer something equivalent for the girls. Again, his response? Instead of accepting our suggestion his rather curt reply was, "Well, I'll just not do any extra credit!" The discussion, if you can call it that, was ended at that point.

Is it true that life is not fair? Of course it is true. A lot of things are not fair. The circumstances and experiences of life do not treat persons with equanimity. Sometimes the unfairness is the result of personal greed or self-serving power. Sometimes it's because of insensitivity, or poor exercise of judgment in passing laws and political or social policy. Sometimes it is just because "things happen" and you happened to be the victim and I was not. Unfairness is simply part of the fabric of a broken, sinful world. Jesus himself pointed out in Matthew 5:45 that God "makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust." Sun and rain can be both good and bad, depending. In other words, life is what it is, and it does not always treat people the same. Some, like our daughter's teacher, would say, "Life is unfair. Deal with it."

However, and this is the important point in all this, God does not expect his own people to contribute to the unfair behaviors and practices around us. God's people are expected to exemplify a higher




standard of personal conduct that not only treats people equally but responds with compassion, sensitivity, and positive action toward those who are treated unfairly. In Amos 5:24, God states that superficial, phony righteous behavior does not cut it with him, but instead demands that "justice roll down like waters and righteousness like an ever flowing stream." In Micah 6:8, God lays out clearly what he expects of His People: "to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God." In other places, including Jesus' teachings, God's people are expected to look after the socially downtrodden, the least, and those who are victimized by the rest of society. In other words, those who are treated unfairly. Justice - treating people fairly – is the standard God expects of his people.

Sometimes, because of our own sin and short-sightedness, we wittingly or unwittingly contribute to life's unfairness. When this happens, repentance is called for on our part and a renewed effort to live up to God's standards. Nevertheless, while life is not always fair, we, as God's people, are called to do all we can to combat the unfair practices and policies of our world and, at the very least, not contribute to it for the sake of those who are treated unfairly. We are called to a higher way of living. Life is not fair, but for those who understand and live by God's




