

Dear Heloise: When I'm ready to try a new color on my wall, I never paint it directly on the wall. I buy the smallest amount of the color I want and paint it on a foam POSTER BOARD. I can then use pushpins to put it up where I want to try it and see how it looks. If it's not the right shade or color, I don't have a splotch of paint on the wall. - Kathy Beery, Harrisonburg, Va.

Dear Heloise: I have a painted black chest in my bathroom, and drops of overspray from my hair spray have gotten on it. I tried to wash it off with mild soap and water, but it doesn't work. I'm afraid to use an abrasive cleaner because it might remove or scratch the surface. Do you think I could use mineral spirits? If not, what can I use? - Vickie I., Westerville, Ohio

I'm afraid that mineral spirits (paint thinner) may take the paint off and ruin the finish. Try this instead: Put rubbing alcohol on a terry or microfiber towel and test on a concealed area first to be sure the surface isn't damaged. Work on a small area at a time – it might take a bit of elbow grease. When you have gone over all the spots, clean any residue left with another clean, damp cotton cloth. This should get the job done. - Heloise

BOXING UP BOOKS

Dear Heloise: This is in response to the reader who wrote in about proper boxing of books. In any of the lower states, cardboard boxes are not good storage for any item, as they can house cockroaches, silverfish and other household pests.

A plastic storage bin with an airtight lid will not only keep out pests, but also keep books from being exposed to air, water and other elements. When moving and using cardboard boxes, always leave the boxes outside while you unpack. Take individual items out of the box before bringing it into a new home.




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

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Bidding Quiz

1. Two spades. Partner's notrump bid indicates 15 to 18 points, notrump distribution and one or more diamond stoppers. But even though your partner has stated a preference to play the hand in notrump, you should not be willing to do so. With 6-3-3-1 distribution and only two highcard points, you're far more likely to do better in spades.

Indeed, the chances are that your partner will go down two or three tricks in one notrump, while it's about even money that you can make eight tricks with spades as trump. This is because in notrump, your spades may prove worthless, while if they are trump, they're likely to produce four or five tricks.

In the sequence given, two spades is uniformly regarded as a weakness bid. In effect, you are saying that you think two spades is a safer contract than one notrump, and partner is strongly urged to pass.

2. Three spades. With 10 high-card points opposite partner's 15 to 18, you know there's a game in the offing, and you should let partner in on the good news by jumping to three spades. Partner will raise to four spades with three-card or better support, and retreat to three notrump with a doubleton, after which you will retire from the auction.

3. Three notrump. Nine tricks in notrump are much more likely than 11 tricks in clubs, and you should therefore raise one notrump to three. It would be tactically wrong to bid three clubs. While that bid would be forcing, it also would be pointless. There can be no advantage in telling the enemy the type of hand you have when it does not help your side get to the right contract.

4. Two diamonds. With 11 high-card points, you must, of course, think in terms of game, but a notrump contract is not very appealing with 4-4-4-1 distribution. Indeed, if partner has four cards in either major, game in that suit is almost surely your best spot.

The best way of discovering whether partner has either four spades or four hearts is by cuebidding West's suit. You intend to raise partner directly to four of a major if he bids either of them, and to raise to three notrump if he rebids two notrump.
