Juenemann is a virtual student, taking 14 hours of class work through Fort Hays State University via the Internet. She

# Rodeo to feature trained bull

**PHILLIPSBURG** — Rodney Hayes' everyday job consists of saddling up an 1,800-pound bull and riding him.

Yes, you read that correctly ... a bull.

Billy the Kid, a Brazilian Gir bull with gentle brown eyes, horns and a big hump, has been trained by Hayes to be ridden, to lie down on his side and to jump through a hoop of fire.

Hayes, from Linden, Texas, has been riding tame bulls in rodeo arenas all of his adult life. He will

be in Phillipsburg to entertain at Kansas' Biggest Rodeo Thursday to Saturday, July 30 to Aug. 1.

Hayes also brings along a couple of ponies and young cow-kids who do tricks. He says he has trained his animals to overcome their inherent fear of fire and heights. He can work cows, rope steers, run barrels and do all sorts of tricks while riding the bull.
