The Colby Swim Club finished its season at the Northwest Kansas Swim League meet July 10 and 11 in Wray, Colo., placing second out

of eight teams. Brennon Overton and Jessica Leiker were the team's top swimmers during the two-day meet. Overton first among boys 9-10 with 35 points and Leiker was first among girls 15-18 with 32.

Overton collected six gold medals, taking first in all five of his races and a relay.
