

HEALTH PROGRAMS/ASSESSMENTS

All students up to the age of nine years enrolling in school for the first time in Kansas shall present official health assessment records showing evidence that the child has had a physical examination within twelve months of school entry. All new students MUST also have a copy of their birth certificate with them when they enroll.

All students entering school for the first time in Kansas must present official immunization records showing evidence that the child has been inoculated for the following: Diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, poliomyelitis, mumps, rubella and German measles. Hepatitis B vaccination is recommended for all students. Students who have not completed the required immunizations within 90 days after the beginning of school may be excluded from further attendance. Forms are available in the school nurse's office in the primary building. Further information may be obtained by calling the school nurse at 460-5111. (KSA 72-5209 et. seq.)
