host mom worked as a helper at the Catholic church, cleaning and helping with Mass.

She said she also had a host "sister" who was from Germany, and was especially glad to have someone her own age in the house. She said she actually learned more of the German language than Gaelic, because of the closeness of the "sister" from Germany.

Domsch said the school she went to was a private Protestant school, which she thought was the only Protestant school in southern Ireland. High school is actually six years in Ireland, she said, and the starting age for high school is 10 years old. Grades one through six are in a different system called a primary school and the high school is called secondary school.

"The teachers were tough," she said. "I made straight A's here, but B's and C's there, but I really got a good education.

"The school is different, because students are all required to wear uniforms,"

she added, "as there is a strict dress code. of potatoes, she said. Even the girls had to wear a tie, black shoes and a blazer."

Courses she took in school were much like here. She took math, English, geography, business, art and biology. Domsch said she had very little home work, which she

She said the Irish like sports, but it's not as big there as here, however, soccer is the number one game. She thought it was odd that the school had a boys' Ping-Pong team. The boys loved American football, and played in their spare time, she said.

Domsch recalled that there were about 20 foreign students in the school, from the U.S., Germany, Canada, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, and Hong Kong.

Monaghan is north of Dublin, and near the dividing line between North and South Ireland. The town was somewhere between 10,000 and 20,000 people, she said, and there was a convent for high school girls, a boys school and one public school.

"It's colder there than here," she said, "and it's a chilling cold, because it's so damp. It snowed only twice, and when the sun came out, which was rare, it got to about 60 degrees."

She said she had a nice tan when she left here last August, but soon lost it because the sun didn't shine, and her host mother thought she was getting sick, because she was beginning to look pale.

She said she learned to eat foods seasoned with curry, and likes it, but thinks she was thoroughly overdosed on potatoes.

"I think I'm ruined for potatoes for a long time," she said. "Every day we had potatoes that had been steamed, and then served with lots of butter. I've been OD'd on potatoes. French fries are chips to the Irish, actual chips are called crisps, and cookies are called biscuits."

Domsch fixed American fare while there, and said they liked meatloaf, goulash and tuna casserole. She said her grandmother The main industry was farming, with lots sent her some pumpkin so she could make a

pie, and they liked it, but had never heard of it, because they didn't have canned pumpkin in Ireland.

Domsch said, for breakfast they had weetabix, which was a something like oatmeal biscuits with milk and sugar, and they had a dish they called muesli with raisins and hazelnuts that wasn't too bad, and she longed for a dish of Lucky Charms!

Domsch said she couldn't believe how tiny the roads seemed. She said they were just narrow roads, and that it was strange that they drove on the "wrong" side of the

Domsch said she'd like to go back just to visit. She said she had learned an appreciation of other cultures, but was glad to be back home.

She also expressed a huge appreciation of the people in the Brewster community, who she said, helped her make the trip by

supporting her fund drive efforts. Domsch is the daughter of Kevin and Cindy Domsch of Brewster.

Panel details who should get swine flu vaccine first

Panel members say they hope swine flu vaccinations will be opened up quickly. "The only sin is vaccine left in the refrigerator," said Dr. William Schaffner, a Vanderbilt University flu expert, in a comment to the panel.

The panel also said if vaccine is scarce, the government could require that a much tighter group be at the front of the vaccination line, numbering about 40 million. That would include pregnant women and household contacts of small children, just like in the general priority recommendation. But the others would be children ages sixmonths through four years, children with chronic medical conditions and only health care and emergency services workers who have direct contact with patients.

It's a worst-case scenario that officials aren't expecting, but they wanted to have a plan for it just in case, said officials with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the federal agency that reviews the panel's recommendations.

The range of recommendations reflects how hard it is to plan for swine flu, officials said. Some health officials have compared the exercise to predicting a hurricane. The storm — or virus — is itself unpredictable; it could grow more vaccines can also affect survival. around mid-October.

"It's better to prepare and have the storm fizzle than to be sitting there with no way off the island when the tsunami rolls in," said Kristine Sheedy, a Centers for Disease Control communications specialist.

Variables with the swine flu virus can range from whether it mutates into a form that is more deadly, spreads more efficiently, or is better at fighting off current antiviral medications.

Variables with the vaccine include potential production problems. Production of the vaccine will be a prodigious feat: The government has already purchased 195 million doses for the coming fall and winter, which far eclipses the 125 million or so doses generally produced for seasonal flu

Four vaccine manufacturers are wrapping up seasonal flu vaccine production and have begun production of swine flu vaccine. But another company, Sanofi Pasteur, has been more delayed and may not finish seasonal vaccine production until September, a company spokeswoman said. Sanofi is among the largest producers of flu vaccine, so those delays could have a significant ripple effect.

Packaging, distribution and other steps can take a month or more. For those reasons, the government's best guess at the moment is dangerous or suddenly weaken. 40 million doses will be available The availability of supplies or in September and 120 million by

First identified in April, swine flu has likely infected more than 1 million Americans, the center believes, with many of those suffering mild cases never reported. There have been 302 deaths and nearly 44,000 laboratory-identified cases, according to numbers released last week.

Stimulus project completed

OSAWATOMIE (AP) - State local and federal officials are celebrating what's being billed as the first project in the U.S. to be completed under a new federal program.

That \$3 billion program directs stimulus dollars toward construction of affordable housing. Woodland Hills Estate in Osawatomie received about \$2.4 million.

Woodland Hills will provide homes for 24 elderly Kansans and replace housing lost in a 2007 flood. It was three-quarters finished earlier this year, when developers lost the bulk of their financing because of the economy.

an unmarked car. Under the old law, this offender could not be charged with fleeing an officer.

The new law redefines an "appropriately marked vehicle" as any vehicle equipped with a siren or flashing light.

"I was pleased to work with the Attorney General and bring forth this legislation to prevent future predators from escaping justice on such a technicality. Lawrence residents and all Kanthis legislation," Davis said.


