




Difficulty Level ★★★★





Bidding Quiz

1. Pass. A takeout double shows the values for an opening bid, but the range of strength may extend from roughly 13 points to more than 20. Also, distributional features may range from poor, as in this hand, to very good, as in some of the succeeding hands.

The doubler has an obligation to identify the nature of his hand after partner responds to the double. With minimum values -- 13 to 15 points -- he passes if partner has made a non-jump response. With this hand, therefore, South should 20 not bid again. If he were to continue bidding, he would be implying values in excess of a mini- 22 mum double.

2. Two hearts. The player who responds to the double (in this case, North) may have a very weak hand, since he is merely obeying partner's command that he bid. The doubler therefore has to tread gingerly when deciding what to do next.

Here, South can afford to bid two hearts, not on the basis of his high cards, which are close to minimum, but on the basis of his distribution, which is reasonably good. The four trumps and the singleton club, as well as the strong diamond suit, are trick-taking features that pull the hand out of the minimum class and justify a further bid. The single raise is mildly invitational and shows 16-18 points (including distribution).

3. One notrump. This rebid indicates the high-card values and distribution for an opening notrump bid, plus at least one stopper in the opening bidder's suit.

4. Three hearts. Here you have only 15 highcard points, but the chances of making game with this hand are far better than those in the preceding 18-point hand.

The way to gauge such hands is not by point count but by the probable number of winning tricks. Thus, if partner has as little as five hearts to the queen and the queen of diamonds, there is an excellent prospect of making four hearts. The three-heart bid (highly invitational) asks partner to carry on to game with values of this sort.


5. Four hearts. Here, the chance of making 10 tricks is so good that you bid the game yourself without running the risk of partner's passing a lesser bid. If partner has nothing but five hearts to the jack, there is a reasonable chance of making 10 tricks.
