
Weather Corner

changed names with a German connection. Since her family lived in the middle of Kansas, she said, they didn't feel the threat, and kept the original spelling.

She graduated from Skyline High School near Pratt and began her college days in Lamar, Colo., studying horse management and training before she transferred to Colby to be in the vet tech program.

"I thought veterinary medicine would be a good field, and a good fit for the farm," she said.

As a student here, she said she worked some at the Oakley clinic and that is where she got to know Dr. Tammy Swartz, owner of the clinic.

"I started my job hunt when I was ready to get out of school, and came to Colby to see Dr. Swartz," she said. "I continued my job hunt tour of Nebraska, South and North Dakota, and I sort of thought North Dakota was a good place. But when I came back to Colby to get some

answers and advice, she offered me a job, and the rest is his-

She said dad raises wheat farmer and does custom grazing and her mother is a secretary for an auction and real estate company and has a puppet ministry group at her church.
