ment heads had asked her to play around with the budget figures to see if they could get more than the 1 percent raise for county employees allowed for in the published

Harms told the commissioners she had come up with a figure of 2 percent with very little added to the property tax levy.

Commissioner Byron Sowers said he thought with the increase in the health in-

surance, the 1 percent should be sufficient. "I'd like to get more for my wheat and more for my cattle," he said, "but I have to

live with what I have.' Chairman Ken Christiansen said with the economic conditions right now, he felt comfortable with the 1 percent raise.

Commissioner Steele said he also favored leaving the budget at the figure they had published.

No one appeared to question the budget.

Phase 1 will be around 70 turbines in North Randall, Morgan and Summer townships.


