Cookbooks help busy days

With this in mind, I want to talk about several good cookbooks that we have added to our collection.

The first is "Don't Panic: More Dinner's in the Freezer: A Second Helping of Tasty Meals You Can Make Ahead," by Susie Martinez, Vanda Howell and Bonnie Garcia. This book begins by telling the reader about how to save money by purchasing things while on sale and cooking in bulk. The recipes look easy but good. Helpful hints on freezing are also given. Even freezing a lemon meringue pie is explained.

"Country Living: One-Dish Country Suppers: Delicious Casseroles, Frittatas, Roasts and Stews." The book discusses using cast-iron Dutch ovens, heavy enamel cookware and even slow cookers. The pictures were inspiring to me. They called me to try a few of the fabulous looking dishes.

I always appreciate it when a cookbook provides the picture of the recipe. This way I sort of know how something is suppose to look when it is done. I love the international recipes such as Korean-Style Short Ribs, Tortilla Casserole, Cuban Coffee Chili,

Indian-Spiced Lamb Chile and Baked Beans with Kielbasa. There are also traditional recipes made with beef, veal, lamb, pork, poultry and seafood, as well as recipes for the vegetarian.

A third book is "Cooking Light: Fresh Food Fast." Mary Kay Culpepper, the editor in chief, provides over 280 recipes that have no more than five ingredients, and take 15 minutes to cook. Once again, each recipe has a photo (you can really see how visual we have become as a society!), and then simple instructions.

At the end of the book, it gives some helpful recipes for four sauces, as well as fast sides. What I came to appreciate in this cookbook is whether you are just beginning to cook low-fat, or have been doing so for years, the cook can pick up quick ways to prepare food without having to add all the extra calories and fat. What I often do is find a recipe in a book that is good, and then see how it informs me on preparing my favorite recipes in a low-fat or fresh manner.

Another book is "Our Best Dia-Another book that looks fun is betic Living Recipes," by Better Homes and Gardens. It has 500 recipes, including creative chapters such as company-worthy meals, slow cooker favorites and delightful desserts. It also has a short chapter that discusses managing your diabetes and implementing food exchanges.

Once again, the pictures are delightful! So if you are over your limit on food intake as a diabetic, don't read this at that time. Read it when you are in a planning mode and want to create a special meal for you to enjoy with friends.

A home-written cookbook is "Recipes From KAFCE" by the

Kansas Association for Family and Community Education. This group of women began in 1914 under the Extension program. They wanted to better understand food preservation. The group has evolved into 269 extension clubs across the state. If you are looking for something for a potluck or a healthy delicious meal, look here. Do you have a favorite recipe from one of the women in our area clubs? You may be able to find her recipe, since each recipe has the name of the person who donated it. Happy cooking and eating!


