Colby junior varsity team wins seven straight games

The Colby High junior varsity volleyball team has been on a roll as of late, taking their last seven games.

The girls picked up three of their seven wins on Monday at a quad with Phillipsburg and Liberal at Hays.

The girls had to come from behind to win two of their matches. After dropping their first set to Liberal (23-25), they rallied and won their next two (25-13, 15-8).

The Lady Eagles found themselves in the same predicament when they played Phillipsburg. The Lady Panthers won the first set (25-18), but Colby mounted a successful comeback winning the next two sets (25-22, 15-9).

The girls had less trouble with Hays, sweeping the Lady Indians (26-24, 25-21).

The Colby girls also won their own tournament at the high school gym on Saturday, winning all four matches that day. They girls defeated Scott City (18-25, 29-27, 15-7) and swept Oakley (25-16, 25-12), Quinter (25-16, 25-12), and Dighton (25-19, 25-18).

Coach Leslie Wagoner said she wanted to thank teachers Linda Jones, Kim Bunk and Lamoreaux Fulwider; Lynn Carpenter, attendance secretary and head cheerleading coach; counselor Joni Clark-Leiker; Megan Pope, district curriculum secretary; Melissa Augustine, psychological services; activities director Larry Gabel; Principal Don Krebs; and activities secretary Tonya Staats for helping run the tournament.

The girls will play again at 9 a.m. on Saturday at Hays.

keep their momentum going, however, as they dropped their next three matches to Goodland (29-27, 25-18), Oakley (25-27, 20-25) and Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays (23-25, 24-26).

"They were all close matches, but I think with the excitement and energy of Homecoming week, we just got tired," said Wagoner.
