Colby High golfers headed to Hutchinson

The Colby High School girls golf team had two of its members qualify for state at regionals on Wednesday at the Meadow Lake Golf Course.

Sophomore Kaylee Keck and freshman Karly Kriss finished ninth and eleventh respectfully to qualify for state at Hutchinson. Keck shot a 104 and Kriss shot a 105.

Keck defeated Christa Denault of Concordia in a playoff for ninth place. She received a medal for finishing in the top ten.

The Lady Eagles finished fifth out of eight teams with 468 overall points. Ulysses placed first with 401 points. The other teams who participated were Concordia, Russell, Pratt, Buhler, Nickerson and Hugoton.

Junior Bailey Koerperich shot a 126 and finished 27th and junior Abby Miller came in 31st with 133. Junior Kelsey Shields shot a 137 and finished 34th and junior Kate Ostmeyer placed 37th with a score of 146.

Football team tries to avenge defeat in tonight's game against Panthers

The Colby High School football team will be looking to avenge last year's loss when they play Concordia at 7 p.m. tonight at Dennen Field.

The Eagles suffered a tough 22-14 loss to the Panthers last year. It was arguably the teams worst loss of the season.

An Colby victory would provide the team with a feeling of retribution after last season's defeat.

Junior quarterback Kale Arnbarger will be going into the game one week removed from completing 7 of 14 passes for 206 yards against Smith Center in a losing effort. The Eagles' passing game has improved throughout the year and has turned Colby's offense into a two-dimensional threat. His favorite target has been junior

wide receiver Corbin Stephens who caught four passes for 125 yards last week and pulled down a 39-yard touchdown reception.

Stephens has not been Arnbarger's only target this season, however. He has hooked up with other receiving threats including sophomore tight end Ryan Parker and sophomore wide receiver Dalton Snyder who have both caught touchdown passes this season. He has also connected with junior running back Andrew Flanagin on numerous occasions. Flanagin has provided a double threat to opposing teams due to his ability to run and catch the ball.

Colby's offense will be looking for another big game from their backfield. Senior running back Ethan Stickel, senior fullback Adam Weber, Flanagin and Arn-

berger have provided the boy's offense with several running threats this season. This has made the Eagles' offense unpredictable and it has kept opposing defenses off balance because they can't solely concentrate on shutting down one or two players. Stickel has been the team's leading rusher averaging over 100 yards per game.

The Eagles' defense is coming off a solid performance against Smith Center that would have been more impressive if it weren't for the Redmen's two long touchdown runs.

Colt Rogers had not ran for a 44 and 40 yard touchdowns, it would have been an entirely different game. Colby will be looking to prevent any long touchdown runs in tonight's game.

Trojans veteran coach to retire after 34 years

Colby Community College wrestling coach Steve Lampe will be retiring after this year's wrestling season after 34 years of coaching at the school.

He will officially end his career on May 20, 2010. The college board approved his retirement at a special meeting Monday in Thomas Hall.

Lampe said he felt like there were a whole lot better things he could be doing at this point in his life.

"For the first time in 34 years I'm doing something for myself and my family instead of the school," he said. "It's time for a change and I'm going to take it."

Dr. Lynn Kreider, president at the college said Lampe had a tremendous history at the college and added that he was sure he would be missed.

"Like any athlete or coach you have to determine when it's time to go and I assume that's what he's

done," he said.

Lampe leaves behind quite a legacy and his replacement will have some big shoes to fill.

His wrestling team won the national championship in 1999 and they were runners up in 2003. He was inducted to the National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 1990, the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame in 1999, and the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2003.

In 2009 he become the only junior college coach to ever be named a distinguished member of the national hall of fame.

During his tenure at the college he has coached 19 National champions and five National Collegiate Athletic Association Division 1. One of the national champions he coached was two-time Olympian David Cormier. Cormier was part of the 1999 championship team.

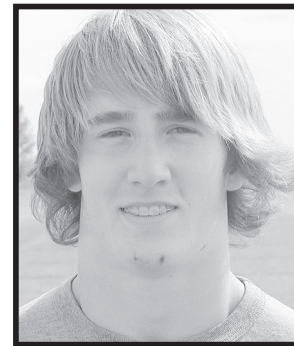
Lampe was named coach of the year by the association in 1984 and 2000 and the group presented him with man of the year award during the Trojans' 1997-1998

wrestling season. He was also given the National Wrestling College Association Coaching Excellence Award in 2005.

Cats take on Aggies

MANHATTAN (AP) — A week after surrendering 66 points and more than 700 yards to Texas Tech, another high-scoring team from Texas is just about the last thing Kansas State wants to see.

There is, however, no getting around it. Texas A&M will be in Manhattan on Saturday night, averaging 513 yards and 37 points per game.

The fact the Aggies are fresh off a disappointing 36-31 loss to a nationally ranked Oklahoma State is no comfort to the Wildcats. For one thing, the similarities between Texas A&M and Texas Tech are obvious.

"Both defenses get to the ball and on offense they have a quarterback who can run and throw the ball," said running back Keith Valentine.

The shellshocked Kansas State defense was overwhelmed by Texas Tech's prodigious offense. In 17-plus seasons, no Bill Snyder-coached Kansas State team had ever surrendered more than

64 points.

But Texas Tech's first-time starter at quarterback, Steven Sheffield, threw for 490 yards and seven TDs, completing passes to 10 different receivers.

Now comes Aggies quarterback Jerrod Johnson, who leads the Big 12 in total offense at 356 yards a game.

If the Wildcats manage to intercept one of his passes, it will be his first of the year.

"He presents a lot of challenges for us," said Snyder. "He is putting up some very good numbers, both through the air and on the ground."

The Wildcats, in the meantime, were trying to sort out their own quarterback situation.

Sixth-year senior Grant Gregory seemed to have won the job with his play in a 1-point victory over Iowa State the week before the Texas Tech debacle. But Gregory played so poorly against the Red Raiders he was replaced by the man everyone thought he'd
