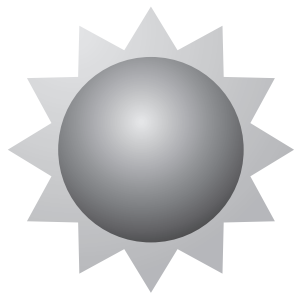


Weather Corner

Governor seeks federal aid for neighboring county farms

TOPEKA (AP) — Gov. Mark Parkinson is asking the secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to declare three western Kansas counties a disaster area because of summer storms.
 Parkinson has asked Secretary Tom Vilsack to make the declaration for Cheyenne, Rice and Sherman counties. Severe storms hit the area between July 17 and Sept. 23, causing damage to crop production, farm equipment and fences.
 High winds and hail took a toll on corn, soybean, sorghum and sunflower production across the region.
 If approved, farmers in those three counties would be eligible for low-interest loans through the USDA's Farm Service Agency, as well as other aid available through the Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments Program included in the 2008 farm bill.

Senate hopefuls report finances

TOPEKA (AP) — In the race to replace Sam Brownback in the U.S. Senate, Rep. Jerry Moran widened the campaign funding gap between himself and fellow Kansas Republican Rep. Todd Tiahrt, according to documents filed Thursday with federal election officials.
 Moran reported to the Federal Election Commission that he has more than \$3.4 million in cash on hand, up from \$3.1 million at the end of July. Tiahrt began and ended the reporting period with about \$1.4 million available.
 For the period through the end of September, Moran's campaign said he raised more than \$520,000, while spending a little more than \$181,000. Tiahrt reported raising more than \$341,000, and spending \$353,500.
 The U.S. Senate race is considered the marquee race in Kansas, pitting the two longtime Republican congressmen in a primary to succeed Brownback, who kept a promise to step down after serving two terms in the Senate. He is running for governor.
 Moran's campaign spokesman, Aaron Trost, said the report suggests momentum building for Moran less than a year from the primary.
 "This strong fundraising report, coupled with Jerry's wide lead in the polls and key endorsements, make Jerry the clear front-runner in this race and give his campaign unshakable momentum in the months ahead," Trost said.
 Moran, elected in 1996, represents the 1st District of Kansas, which covers most of western and

 ground, because of the cool temperatures."
 Milliman said the reason late-planted wheat takes a greater seeding rate is because of the plant's ability to produce the desired tillers to make a good yield.
 He said as far as soybeans in Thomas County, there is a fairly good acreage that has already been harvested with acceptable moisture and good yields.
 "The rule of thumb with soybeans," Aiken said, "is that after they have turned the yellow-brown color, they still need seven days of good drying conditions. The color is right, but the conditions haven't been conducive to drying, and the dry land beans have a good yield potential too."
 Over all, the forecast is for more of a normal weather pattern, and farmers are saying, that although moisture is always welcome, they're anxious to get into the fields.
 Cattlemen should check their stalks to make sure it is not present before turning cattle into stalk fields.
 Crop specialist Brian Olson, who covers all of Northwest Kansas for the Research Station, said the freezing temperatures stopped some of the late planted crops from total maturity, and those fields that are ready for harvest are hindered by mud and high moisture content.
 "There's some really good crops, but we just can't get them out of the fields," he said.
 He said most of the wheat is planted, and producers need a few days of nice weather to get it finished up, before they concentrate on fall harvest.
 "We're always happy with the moisture, but it may set planting back to the point that farmers will have to increase their seed rate per acre. What's in the ground now is just a little slower coming through the
