

Hints from Heloise

Salt sneaks in to many foods

Dear Heloise: My diabetic husband was put on a SALT-RESTRICTED DIET - this meant sticking to the recommended guidelines for salt. We thought that we had been careful with salt. I never added salt to my cooking, and there was no saltshaker on the table except for when eating

Whew – did we have a violent awakening! Salt or sodium is everywhere! Not just in canned soup and vegetables, but frozen vegetables can have added sodium, too. So, you must read labels! A good restaurant may custom-fix food if you explain the dietary restrictions.

There are commercial salt-free seasonings, and you have a great Heloise recipe for salt-free seasoning to make at home. I mix up quintuple batches and use it just about everywhere. When seasoning without salt, we use three to four times as much.

Unsalted food has a tendency to taste like cardboard. Give the unsalted diet time (three to four months), and your taste buds will wake up and you will taste the flavor of food.

Meanwhile, use some lemon juice or lime juice in place of salt. I keep a bowl of freshly cut lemons on the table, and with a quick squeeze I zip up eggs, potatoes and fresh veggies. – Sharon M., Norphlet, Ark.

Sharon, how right you are! Lemon and lime are wonderful for enhancing most foods. I use a crystallized lemon "powder" that is fantastic on veggies, especially fresh tomatoes, cucumbers and carrots!

COFFEE-FILTER SEPARATION


And here's another hint from Jack Dube of Boynton Beach, Fla. He says: "For those people like me who have trouble extracting a single filter for the coffee pack, try this: Tack a small piece of double-faced sticky tape to the inside of a cabinet door. Lightly touch the edge of the outer rim of the bottom filter to the tape, and a single filter flakes off." - Heloise

EASY OPEN

Dear Heloise: I use the flat part of a spoon handle to open a cereal box. Using the spoon, I swipe it in both directions. This eliminates paper cuts. It also works well for opening the bottom when it's empty to prepare for flattening the box for recycling. – Dale, via e-mail


An Elegant Performance

Assume you get to five clubs on the bidding 16 shown and West leads the king of spades. You ruff and observe that your chances of making the contract are not good.

First, there's the possibility of losing a trump trick if the trumps are not divided 3-2. Second, there's a strong probability, considering West's opening weak two-bid, that East has the ace of diamonds and that you might therefore lose three 20 Mineral diamond tricks.

When you play the A-K-Q of clubs, the trumps turn out to be divided 3-2, so the only problem remaining is to limit yourself to two diamond losers. Is there any way you can accomplish that task, you ask yourself, and the answer is that you have an excellent chance of doing so.

After drawing trumps, you cross to the ten of hearts and ruff a spade. You then cash the A-K-Q of hearts, discarding a diamond from your hand, and ruff still another spade. Having run East out of spades, hearts and trumps, this is the threecard end position:



You lead the three of diamonds, and you're sure to win a diamond trick, regardless of what West does. If he plays the four, you cover with dummy's five, forcing East to win and yield a trick to dummy's king. If West instead plays the jack of diamonds on the three, you cover with dummy's king. East wins with the ace but must then yield the game-going trick to your ten.


