The Golden Plains Bulldogs remain undefeated in district play after hammering Weskan 48-0 on

With the win, they improved to 6-2 overall and 4-0 in their district. They have one remaining district game, at 7 p.m. tonight against Cheylin at Bird City before entering bi-district playoffs next week.

Although the Bulldogs started the game with a penalty on the kickoff, the defense held Weskan and forced them to punt. Senior Isaac Broeckelman made a quick seven-yard gain and classmate Corey Shaw ran for a first down.

On the next play, Broeckelman broke through the Weskan defense and ran in for the first touchdown with just over two minutes off the clock. The two-point conversion was good when junior Tate Preston completed a pass to senior Jonathan Broeckelman, making it 8-0 Golden Plains.

The Bulldogs kicked off to Weskan once again, but the defense held, forcing the Coyotes to punt a second time. Preston made good yardage on a quarterback keeper, but a holding call on the Bulldogs erased the gain. Shaw then caught the ball and made a big gain for a first down. He then ran in a touchdown, but the two-point conversion try was no good, bringing the score to 14-0.

Weskan continued to struggle before turning the ball back to the Bulldogs. The Golden Plains offense continued to push the ball downfield with senior Jeremy Hunter gaining yet another successful short run by Preston increased the Bulldog lead to 22-0.

After the kickoff, the Bulldog defense continued to stop Weskan's efforts and Golden Plains Tuesday at Rexford.

regained possession. Broeckelman gained a quick first down only to have it called back due to a false-start penalty. Preston was able to regain the lost yards and gain the first down. He had another big gain on the next play to take it to within a few feet of the goal line, which allowed Jonathan Broeckelman to run it in for one more touchdown before the end of the quarter. A successful two-point conversion run from senior Drake Moss gave the 'Dogs a 30-0 lead at the end of the first.

The Coyotes started the second quarter off with the ball, but fumbled and saw it recovered by Bulldog senior Jordan Spresser. On the first snap, quarterback Preston handed it off to Issac Broeckelman, who broke free and ran it into the end zone to increase Golden Plains' lead to 36-0. The Bulldogs got a penalty on the twopoint conversion and fumbled the snap with 24 seconds left. The score remained the same for the duration of the half.

The Bulldogs took advantage of their first possession on offense in the third when Issac Broeckelman ran for another score. A failed twopoint conversion left the Bulldogs with a 42-0 lead.

Shaw kicked off one more time to the Coyotes. Issac Broeckelman intercepted a Weskan pass, but had to turn it back over due to a penalty.

Once the Bulldogs regained possession, Shaw broke through for a 75-yard run into the end zone to give Golden Plains a 48-0 victory with 8:44 left in the third.

The game ended because the score limit is 45 points.


With the win, the Bulldogs touchdown for the home team. A clinched the district championship and first place in the Western Kansas Liberty League.
