After approval of the September minutes, Joyce Hansen noted she had taken a 2009-2010 club yearbook to the Thomas County Historical Society to be included in the recently sorted archives.

President, Kathy Calliham adjourned the meeting to begin her program about the Crazy Horse sculpture in the Black Hills of South Dakota.

She told about the sculptor, Korozak Ziolkowski, who was recruited by the Lakota chiefs of the Sioux tribes in 1939.

The work on the 640-foot-long, 563-foot-tall mountain began in the late 1940s when Ziolkowski was 40 and had only \$174, and his hands were his only tools. The project continues today with members of Ziolkowski's family and others working daily.

Ziolkowski's wife Ruth manages their log home, plus a museum and work on the sculpture. Seven of their 10 children work in this family business and all live within three miles.

The family dream is to develop an Indian university and medical training facility at the complex.

The afternoon concluded with the hostess serving a fall pumpkin dessert.

The next meeting will be Jan. 22 at the Prairie Museum of Art and History, when the club will host the Three of Clubs for a program about the Smithsonian Traveling Exhibit, "Journeys."
