Trojans basketball team wins close game

The Colby Community College basketball team and new coach Dustin Pfeifer started their season off in dramatic fashion on Tuesday night at the Community Building.

The Trojans overcame a 17-point deficit on their way to defeating the Laramie County Golden Eagles from Wyoming 74-71.

Pfeifer was still fired up and breathing fast while being interviewed several minutes after the game.

"One thing about these guys is they've been a second half team," he said.

The Trojans needed a rim-rattling dunk by freshman Jose Pena-Benjamin and a couple of clutch free throws by freshman Regis Schafer in the final minute to seal the win.

Benjamin followed up a missed Trojans' shot with a monstrous jam that gave Colby a 71-70 lead with 41 seconds left. The powerful slam had the rim shaking and brought the crowd to its feet.

The men forced Laramie to turn the ball over on the next play and sophomore Aireus Stephenson collected the ball for Colby. The ball eventually found its way to Schafer, who was fouled. He hit

one of two free throws to make it 72-70 Trojans. Laramie freshman Terrance Dent was fouled on his team's next turn on offense. he made his first free throw, but his second shot was off the mark. Schafer went up and grabbed the board, but was fouled by a Golden Eagle defender who tried to come over

his back. This time Schafer nailed both his shots.

"His work ethic will take him to the top," said Pfeifer. This left the Golden Eagles with

Laramie's Mike Johnson knifed his way into the lane for a bucket to extend his team's lead to 58-53, but the Trojans were not ready to relinquish the momentum they had built up throughout the half.

Schafer drilled a three-pointer to cut the lead to two, and Stephenson banked in a three from the top of the key to give Colby a 59-58 lead. Several moments later, Benjamin would pick off a pass and take it down court for a one-hand slam to make it 61-59 Trojans with 6:02 remaining. Dent answered the dunk by nailing a three to put the Golden Eagles up 62-61.

Schafer drove the baseline and laid it in to gain the lead back for Colby. A few minutes later, Stephenson took the ball down the lane, split two defenders and laid the ball off the glass with his left hand to give his team a 65-62 lead.


Laramie fought back and tied
