





Dear Heloise: I've heard that putting APPLE SLICES IN BAKING SODA will keep them from turning brown. Is this true? I have baking soda on hand at all times. I'd rather use that instead of purchasing lemon juice when needed. --Tracy, via e-mail

Tracy, baking soda will not keep apples from turning brown, as far as I know. The best thing to use is any citrus juice - lemon, lime or even orange juice - which most of us have on hand. The acid in these juices stops the oxidization.

Apples aren't the only things that turn brown once cut - pears, bananas, peaches and potatoes also do. You can simply put the slices in water until you need them.

Baking soda does have a multitude of other uses around the home. It's a cheap and effective cleaner and deodorizer. 
HANDY BLENDER

SHRIMP SCRAPS



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



Spotty Play

Spot cards can play a key role in the outcome of many deals. The declarer who fails to give full weight to their value can easily bungle a makable contract.

Consider this deal where West led the ten of 26 hearts against four spades. Dummy's jack was taken by East's king, and East exited with a 28 trump.

Declarer drew trumps in two rounds and then 31 played the A-K and another club. He hoped East 33 would be forced to win, in which case any return would aid South's cause. 35

But West overtook the jack of clubs with the queen and shifted to the nine of diamonds. Declarer tried the queen, but it lost to the king. East returned a diamond, and South eventually lost another diamond for down one.

The final result can be blamed entirely on South's failure to appreciate his heart spots. Ten tricks are his for the taking if he wins East's trump return in dummy at trick two and leads the queen of hearts, forcing East to cover with the ace, ruffed by South.

Declarer then draws trumps, crosses to dummy with a club and leads the seven of hearts. After East follows, South discards a club or a diamond.

West wins the seven of hearts with the nine, but declarer now has 10 tricks: six spades, the ace of diamonds, the A-K of clubs and the six of hearts, which has become the high heart.

All declarer need do is notice that after the 10-J-K-8 of hearts are played to the first trick, a heart trick can eventually be developed, since the Q-7-6 are left in dummy while only the ace and nine remain in the opponents' hands.


