The Colby High School boys varsity basketball team lost its season opener 61-38 to Riley sure and getting easy points in the County High School in the first round of the Hays City Shoot Out tournament at Hays High School on Thursday.

The game was a tale of two halves. Unfortunately for the Eagles their turnover-heavy first half left them with a 24-point deficit they couldn't erase in the second.


