

Brewster High womens team beats Cheylin

The Lady Bulldogs beat St. Francis High School 47-42 on Monday. They will play Stratton High School at 6 p.m. on Friday. Their opponents on Saturday will depend on if they win or lose on Friday.

The Brewster High boys and girls varsity basketball teams both were in action at Cheylin in McDonald on Friday.

The Lady Bulldogs found out that five was enough as they defeated Cheylin 39-36 and the varsity team dropped its first game of the season to the Cougars, 61-50

on Friday.

With only five players available for the game, the Brewster girls managed to play the entire game with no substitutes. The Lady Dawgs led at the end of the first quarter 15-8, with senior Nichelle Erskine scoring all the team's points.

The Bulldog defense was impressive in the second, holding Cheylin scoreless. They went to the locker room at halftime with a 28-8 lead.

The Cougars came out tough in the third, and outscored the Dawgs 16-10. However, the Lady Bulldogs still had a 38-24 lead.

The Brewster girls kept its fouls to a

minimum, and outscored the Cougars in the fourth to win the game 56-39. Senior Nichelle Erskine had an outstanding game, scoring 32.

Junior Nicole Connell followed with 9 and sophomore Kasey Hoyt had 8.

Senior Rose Bear added 7. The fifth player was freshman Amber Barrie, who had a great game defensively.

The boy's team were behind by five at the end of the first quarter, 16-11.

The Cougars increased their lead and led by 13 at halftime, 35-22. Hampered by the Cougars' inside game, the Bulldogs were unable to rally, and were behind at the end of the third, 49-34.

The Bulldogs did have a good fourth, outscoring the Cougars 16-12, but it wasn't enough to get them a victory. The final score was in favor of Cheylin, 61-50.

Senior Spencer Holm led the team in scoring with 16 and senior Devan Selby added 15.

Senior Ryan Allen also had double figures, with 10 points. Senior Erik Roeder had 4 and freshman Daymond Hanley had 3.

Sophomore Aaron Luckert chipped in 2 points. The junior varsity boys also lost, 53-33.

Brewster youth focused on improving

The Brewster Junior High boys' basketball team started their basketball season on Nov. 7, with the Brewster Pre-season Tournament.

They played Golden Plains in their first game, and were down by 10 in the first quarter. This is a very young team, with almost none of the players having varsity experience. Coach Mikey Doll said he was pleased with his team's efforts, and thought they played hard after overcoming their nerves in the first quarter. Jace Jorgenson led the Bulldogs with 8 points, Nathan Jorgenson had 4, Carl Mayer had 3, and Layton Werth rounded out the scoring with 2.

The next game for the junior high in the tournament was against Northern Valley. Coach Doll said the Huskies could be the best team they will play all year. The Bulldogs came up short, and

lost 72-16.

CJ Felzien led the Dogs with 8, Mayer had 6, and Nathan Jorgenson chipped in with 2.

In B-team tournament action, the sixth graders played the majority of the game, losing to the Huskies 28-16. The leading scorer was CJ Felzien with 6, Nathan Jorgenson added 4 and Takoda Turner, Werth, and Justin Schmidt had 2 each.

The Bulldogs took on the Cheylin Cougars on Nov. 12 for their first regular season game.

The A-team lost to the Cougars 39-23. The boys struggled to make shots in the first half, but came back in the second to outscore Cheylin. With Felzien out due to illness, the other players adjusted well. Nathan Jorgenson had an outstanding night, scoring 17 and rebounding well. Jace Jorgenson had 5 and Werth added 1.

Playing an experienced Cheylin team, the B-team boys were handed a 30-8 loss. Like the A-Team, they had a much better second half.

Jace Jorgenson scored 6 and Schmidt chipped in 2.

The Sharon Springs Wildcats were the next opponent for the junior high Bulldogs. They made the trip to Wallace County on Nov. 19, but they lost both games.

The A-team boys had a tough first half, but Coach Doll said he made some adjustments at halftime, and he said he was pleased with how his team executed the adjustments. The third quarter was very good for the Bulldogs, and proved that the team could play at a high level of competition.

Felzien scored a team-high 6 and Jace Jorgenson added 4.

The B-team lost its game by 10 points, 20-10. The Bulldogs' offense struggled with the Wildcat press, but Coach Doll said he was pleased with their defensive effort. Felzien and Nathan Jorgenson scored 4 each, and Schmidt had 2.

On Dec. 1, the Bulldogs traveled to Grinnell to take on the Thunderhawks. Foul trouble plagued the Bulldogs, as guard Jace Jorgenson

picked up some quick fouls which led to the Dogs struggling against a good 'Hawk press. The Bulldogs ran their offense well, and played strong defense. Nathan Jorgenson led the team with 12, Felzien added 4, and Mayer and Werth scored 2 each.

For the B-team game, the sixth graders struggled against a more experienced Thunderhawk team. Coach Doll said he looks for improvements from the players as they gain more playing experience. The Bulldogs lost 38-7. Werth had 4, Turner had 2, and Jace Jorgenson added 1.

Coach Doll said he is pleased with the dramatic improvements his players have made since the first day of practice.

The next game for the junior high Bulldogs will be on Friday, Dec. 18 at Brewster when they play the Healy Eagles. The time will be announced at a later date. This will be a "Super Friday" game, since both the junior high and high school teams will be playing the Eagles.

Jayhawks beat Radford

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Cole Aldrich banged inside with Radford's Art Parakhouski, had a couple of shots blocked, and blocked a few of his own.

After facing all those little guys in the preseason, Aldrich welcomed a chance to face another true center.

Aldrich had 15 points and nine rebounds, and No. 1 Kansas held Parakhouski scoreless during a dominating defensive first half to rout Radford 99-64 Wednesday night.

After bowling for 50 years, Al Koenig hit the big number in bowling, a perfect 300 game.

Koenig shot his perfect game during Tuesday night men's bowling league with his team, Al's Painting. It was his second game of the three game set when it came, 12 perfect strikes in a row.

Koenig bowls regularly on two different leagues each week and carries a 190 average. This is his first 300 game and the first 300 game for the Colby Bowl this season.

Koenig started bowling in 1960 and was the sec-

retary for all the men's leagues for 15 years. He also has the highest sanctioned game shot in the old Parkview Lanes of 287, that was located west of Fike Park. That center was closed in 1973 when the Colby Bowl and Fun Center opened.

Now at 70 years of age, Koenig has the record of the oldest bowler in Colby ever to shoot a 300 game.

"This was a very exciting game, all 12 shots were perfect in the pocket," said Charles Schwanke, co-owner of Colby Bowl. "And what an accomplishment to add to his 50 years of bowling."

Koenig will collect \$300 cash, a gold ring, and special 300 award ball for his 300 game.
