Stars, champion teams emerge in 2009

2009 was a good year for sports sistant Coaches of the Year. in Thomas County, with grand champions, state champions and star players from every school. Here are just a few of the year's highlights:

In March, the Colby High wrestling team took first place at the Class 4A state tournament. Coach Matt Simms praised his team, saying they were the hardest-working group he had ever coached. The boys had won the regional competition the week before, sending 11 wrestlers to the state meet in Salina.

It was a season with big accomplishments for the seniors. Tanner Kriss and Breck Arnberger both won all their matches during the season and both finished first in their weight classes at state. Treat Bugbee won a decision over the defending champion in his weight, a victory which Simms credits with giving the team the momentum it needed to snare the boys did take second place at the trophy. Bugbee went on to win 4A state baseball tournament in second place.

The Eagles also took home awards for coaching. Simms was voted Class 4A Wrestling Coach of the Year and his assistants, Ed Schmitt, Rick Williams and Mike the top of the fourth, when the Kersenbrock were all named As-

Junior tennis sensation Caitlyn Wark finished her 2009 season undefeated. She didn't lose a single match the entire year, posting a 36-0 record.

Wark won the 4A state championship in Topeka in October, beating players from Abilene, Hesston, Independence and Topeka Hayden to claim top honors. Even more impressive was that Wark didn't lose a set all year, a streak she continued at the championship.

This was her first year as a Colby singles player. She played doubles in 2008 with senior Lindsey Wilson. The duo was 39-2 and won the state championship, the first for Colby since 1981.

When asked about her winning streak, Wark replied simply, "I hate to lose.'

Another Eagles team nearly took the state championship this year. The Colby High Salina in June.

of sacrifice plays. The Eagles held they had ever had back-to-back their opponents to a one-run lead until the sixth, but the Wildcats ended up winning 4-0.

The boys finished the season with a 24-2 record.

Even though they didn't come home with the championship trophy, their efforts did not go unrecognized. Senior Levi Schlick was named Class 4A Player of the Year. Coach Kevin Cox was Coach of the Year. Four Eagles players, including Schlick and seniors Cade Carter, Stephen Dinkel and Corey Sager, were named to the 4A All-State Team.

The Golden Plains Bulldogs football team capped its season by winning District 8 and Western Kansas Liberty League championships.

The team won six straight games at the end of the season, ending the regular season with a dominating win over Cheylin during a blizzard in October. The Bulldogs were ranked 13th in the state for eight-man football teams.

They lost to the Victoria Knights in the bidistrict round of the November playoffs. The loss was disappointing for the team, but in May. Senior Eric Blanton hit

bidistrict playoff appearances.

The Colby Community College wrestling team took fourth at the junior college Division I national competition in Rochester, Minn., in March and propelled one of its stars to first place in his weight.

Ganbayaar Sanjaa won his match against Bobby Ward of Nassau in overtime for the national championship. Sanjaa had only one loss during the tournament.

Bekzod Abdurakhmonov finished second, also ending his season with only one loss. Ronnie Tetreault finished third and Jernalto Harris seventh. All four were named as Junior College All-Americans.

2009 was a year for breaking records. Not only did the Colby High golf team win the Oberlin Invitation in April by a 34-shot margin, they also set tournament records for low individual score by junior Ryley Haas and low team score.

Not one but two Eagles baseball players broke the school record for home runs in a single season not without its little victories. The three three-run homers during a

Not to be outdone by the boys, freshman Emilea Finley broke the school record for the pole vault less than two weeks later at Rawlins County. Finley vaulted 8 feet, 6 inches for a second-place finish. She also placed first in the 1,600-meter run that day.
