I have chosen a few nonfiction books that are all a bit different, yet may help you in some of your planning next year.

One book that might help you refine your decision-making processes is: "Nudge: Improving Decisions about Health, Wealth and Happiness," by Richard Thaler and Cass Sustein. As the title suggests, this book may help to nudge you into a process you've been struggling to embark on. A nudge can be less painful than a shove and look a lot easier to begin.

Another nonfiction work that discusses why we choose to do things is: "The Impulse Factor: Why Some of Us Play It Safe and Others Risk It All," by Nick Tasler. The title in itself is intriguing. It frames the discussion by helping the reader come to appreciate his or her talents, and tendencies toward impulsive or well-thoughtout risk taking. This book might take you to a new level of understanding and appreciating yourself



People (While They Are Still on This Earth)," by Henry Alford. He looks at what wisdom is and illustrates many by stories from both the famous and regular folk like us. Many readers expected more humor from this author, but sometimes wisdom is poignant and deep.

A fourth book that sounds outrageous is "Freakin' Fabulous: How to Dress, Speak, Behave, Drink, Entertain, Decorate and Generally Be Better than Everyone Else," by Clinton Kelly. While I am not generally impressed with books that tout being better than others, this is kind of a modern day "Emily Post's Etiquette" book for this generation. The neat thing is that it has real, live color photographs to illustrate what is being taught.

There is even a section on speech. What I find fun and enjoyable about this book is that it is positive, written in easy and fun side doors of the library. Happy language that everyone can enjoy.


