Norma Landon, 81, widow of a former publisher of the *Colby Free Press*, died Friday, Jan. 1, 2010, at Shawnee Gardens Nursing Home in Shawnee after a decade-long battle with Alzheimer's disease.

She was born Norma Joye Kinney on Sept. 30, 1928, in Wichita to Alva and Gladys Nighswonger Kinney. She attended Wichita State University, where she was active in Gamma Phi Beta sorority, then began a career as a medical technologist.

In 1951, she married Harold Landon. Mr. Landon, who died in 1992, was a former publisher of the *Colby Free Press*. In 1971, they moved from Wichita to Loveland, Colo., where she worked for the Thompson School District. Later, they moved to Colby, where she worked in real estate, before returning to Wichita in 1990.

Throughout her life, Mrs. Landon believed in serving the

community and those in need. She served Meals on Wheels, served meals to rescue workers after the Big Thompson Flood of 1976 and visited the elderly in nursing homes. She had been a member of Disciples of Christ churches in Loveland, Colby and Wichita, and was active in the P.E.O Sisterhood.

Survivors include a son, Bob Landon, and daughters, Peggy Landon and Jan Landon Ochsner, all of Overland Park; a sister, Marilyn Wynd, Alton, Ill.; five grandchildren; and a great-granddaughter.

nealogical research and tap dancing. She was a member of the Red Hat Society.

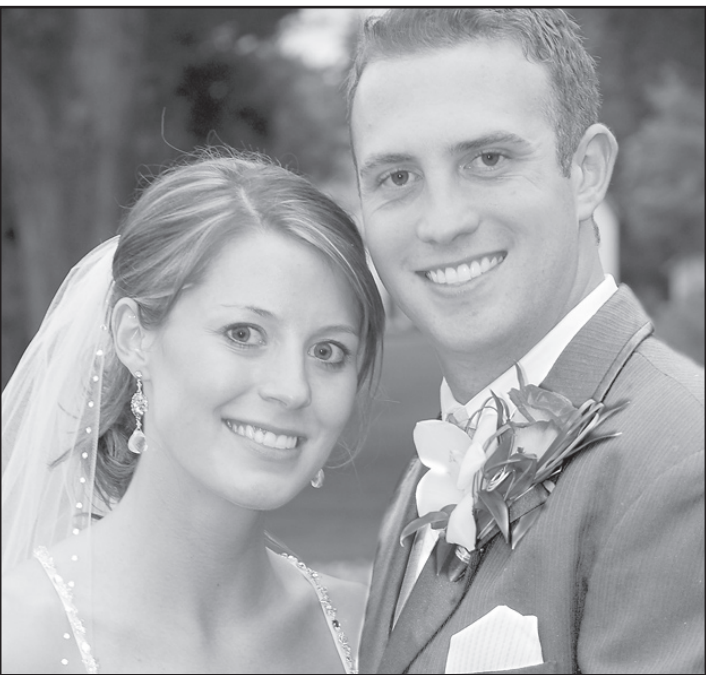
She was preceded in death by her husband and parents, two brothers, Cleve Cook and Aubrey Cook, and a sister Lorraine Merica.
