Colby Trojans lose close one to Dodge City

The Trojans men's basketball team mounted a fierce rally that almost erased a 17-point deficit in the second half Wednesday, but they were unable to get over the hump and beat Dodge City.

The Conquistadors won a hardfought 73-65 victory over Colby at the Community Building.

The Trojans came out strong in the early going. Freshman Regis Schafer buried a three-pointer from the left corner to give the team an 8-2 lead in the games opening minutes. Moments later, sophomore Jordan Michelson hit a cutting Corey Woofter with a pass near the basket that he laid in to extend his team's lead to 10-2.

The Conquistadors' Bruce Massey Jr. banked in a short jump shot to cut the Trojans' lead to 10-4. Dodge City scored the next four points to make it 10-8.

Michelson hit a big-time turnaround from the left baseline with a defender right in his face to give Colby a 12-8 lead. A few minutes later, freshman Michael Morris caught a pass and laid in a transition layup after beating the entire Conquistador defense down the floor to make it 17-8.

Dodge City scored five unanswered points before Morris nailed a short jumper while being fouled to give his team a 19-13 lead. He sank his free throw to extend the Trojans' lead to 20-13.

The Conquistadors mounted a rally and eventually tied the game at 22. The teams continued to trade buckets back and forth, but Dodge City managed to take a 33-30 lead half. They scored two more points and led 35-30 at the break.

Dodge City got hot in the second half, scoring 12 unanswered points to take a 47-30 lead. The solid play of Michelson and soph-

omore Aireus Stephenson sparked Colby's rally. Michelson made several buckets inside the lane and Stephenson hit a three and scored on a tough drive. The Trojans trailed 57-47 with 8:36 left.


Stephenson penetrated down the lane and hit Morris with a nice bounce pass inside that allowed him to get fouled while attempting a layup. Morris hit 1 of 2 shots to cut Dodge City's lead to 57-48. A few minutes later, Woofter made a shot inside the lane after receiving a nice pass from Jose Péna-Benjamin to make it 57-50. Then Woofter fed Morris, who had his man posted up deep inside the lane. Morris took advantage of his good position and made a layup to cut the Conquistadors' lead to 59-52. Moments later, Morris made another bucket to bring the game within five with about five minutes remaining.

"Michael Morris has improved tremendously," said coach Dustin

The Conquistadors' Barnes hit two free throws to make it 61-54. Schafer spun by a defender and found Morris inside for a layup to cut Dodge City's lead to 61-56. The Conquistadors scored four unanswered to broaden their lead to 65-56. Then Michelson tipped in a missed three-pointer by Stephenson to make it 65-58. Moments later, Stephenson sank a three from the left corner to bring Colby within four.

But the Conquistadors refused to let the Trojans complete their comeback. Derrick Parsley Jr. of Dodge City got open inside and made a layup to give his team a 67-61 lead.

Morris continued to battle for with 30 seconds remaining in the the Trojans, rebounding a missed three pointer by sophomore Ethan Stover and laying it in. Colby was unable to stop the Conquistadors from scoring on their next possession and they fell behind 69-63. Dodge City went on to pick up the

Nuggets' defensive effort leads to victory

DENVER (AP) — The Denver Nuggets knocked Dwight Howard out of his comfort zone with tough, physical defense and by using an array of defenders against the Orlando Magic's star center.

Howard ended up having one of his worst games of the season, and the Nuggets fed off their defensive effort, getting 27 points from Carmelo Anthony and 24 from Chauncey Billups in a 115-97 victory over Orlando on Wednesday night.

"Offensively and defensively combined, it might be the best game we've played all year," Nuggets coach George Karl said.

Karl said the defensive effort against Howard was especially important to Denver's dominating performance.

"We were trying to be physical with him," Karl said. "Turning him over five times and not allowing him to make many shots was huge. There's not going to be many teams that hold him under 10 points."

Howard, who had 30 points and 16 rebounds in Orlando's win at Sacramento on Tuesday, had 13 rebounds and three blocked shots but was held to 8 points.

"They did a good job of mixing it up and trying to have me off-balance," said Howard, who made only one of seven shots from the floor while being guarded at various times by Nene, Chris Andersen and Kenyon Martin.

"They swarmed him and their big guys are very athletic," said Matt Barnes, who had a season-high 28 points to lead Orlando.

Said Anthony: "Our big guys did a great job tonight making it tough for him. Each guy we put on him had something different for him."




