

OF SOUP and a sandwich make a terrific lunch or hearty dinner, depending on the soup. Here are some quick hints to make your soup really soupalicious:

• Use a quart of water for every pound of chicken for chicken soup.

• Give soup a sweeter taste and make it more nutritious by adding pureed carrots.

· Thicken soup by adding instant mashed potatoes.

• Remove fat by dropping a couple of ice cubes into the pot. The fat will stick to them - just remove.

• When preparing veggie soup, put in enough water to cover the vegetables by 2 inches or more.

• Finally, taste the soup when done to check the seasoning. Some herbs may lose their flavor or aroma, while others get stronger. Dear Heloise: I make salads almost every day when trying to lose weight. To keep lettuce fresh, tear apart the head, rinse the leaves and spin. Then, with a clean kitchen towel laid on the counter, dry the leaves with paper towels. Store the leaves in large margarine tubs. Fold a paper towel and put it on the bottom of each tub, fill with lettuce, put another paper towel on top and close. BULK HAMBURGER PACKS

CHOPPING NUTS



Two Less One Equals 2,220

This hand was played in a rubber-bridge game many years ago by Camillo Pabis Ticci, wellknown Italian star. The bidding was rather sporting, to say the least - especially East's double of six hearts.

At first or even second glance, it looks as if declarer must lose two spade tricks and go down 3 one. However, Pabis Ticci managed the play exceptionally well and made the slam.

West led the three of spades, which Pabis Ticci 3 recognized as a probable singleton. After winning the spade with dummy's ace, he played the king of trumps and then ruffed the six of clubs. Next he cashed the diamond ace and trumped a diamond in dummy, then ruffed dummy's jack of clubs and trumped his last diamond in dummy. The stage was now set for the elimination play he had planned from the outset.

Pabis Ticci led the king of clubs from dummy, but instead of ruffing it, he discarded the eight of spades. West won the trick with the ace but had to return a diamond or a club, allowing declarer to ruff in dummy while discarding the nine of spades from his hand. As a result, Pabis Ticci made six hearts redoubled for a score of 2,220 points instead of going down one for a loss of 400.

The loser-on-loser play, planned from the start, worked to perfection. In effect, Pabis Ticci exchanged a club trick he didn't have to lose for two spade tricks he seemed certain to lose - a profitable trade by any measure.

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
