Trojan men suffer 66-62 loss

The Trojans' mens basketball team is still searching for its first win of the season after losing a close game to Pratt Community College on Monday.

As has been the case in several of its games this season, Colby was only one or two plays away from getting the win. But they were unable to get over the hump and the Beavers picked up a 66-62 win at the Community Building.

Freshman Jose Péña-Benjamin scored on a tough drive to the basket to give the Trojans a 5-2 lead. Pratt scored the next five points of the game to go up 7-5. Sophomore Aireus Stephenson drilled a threepointer to recapture the lead for Colby. The game stayed tight early in the first half with two teams tied at 13 with a little over 13 minutes left in the half.

The Beavers went on a 7-0 run that was capped off with a threepointer by Pratt's Marcus Smith. Michelson, returning from a one game suspension after getting two technical fouls at Hutchinson on Jan. 23, hit a short jump shot to cut the Beavers' lead to 20-15. Moments later, freshman Corey Woofter nailed a shot from the left baseline to narrow the gap to 20-17. Later in the half, Brewer buried a three-pointer to make it 21-20 Pratt.

Freshman Zach Danner scored on a drive down the left baseline to tie the game at 24 a few minutes later. Stephenson scored on a drive to the basket to give Colby a 32-20 lead with only a few seconds remaining in the half.

Kansas spent the first eight weeks of the season atop the polls and were back there again on Monday. Now, the Jayhawks hope to avoid ably their best basketball of the season.

"My goal for this team is to play to that ranking as opposed to being there," Kansas coach Bill Self said.


Kansas sputtered at times even as it opened the season 14-0, then lost on Jan. 10 to a Tennessee team missing four players.
