Audit says consolidation might save \$138 million

already split grade levels, such as one that has the elementary school and the other the high school.

The second scenario would close 304 schools and reduce the number of teachers and administrators by roughly 1,500, saving \$138 million. The audit said this would be accomplished by eliminating all districts with fewer than 1,600 students.

Sen. Terry Bruce, chairman of the Legislative Post Audit Committee, said the information was helpful but noted the political

difficulty of forcing districts to merge.

"We're just not going to see a huge consolidation effort that we saw in the 1960s," said Bruce, a Hutchinson Republican.

The auditors noted that the savings wouldn't be immediate and would not help the state resolve a projected budget gap of \$416 million. In addition, the state and districts would face additional costs for transportation and to expand or build high schools. The audit didn't examine the impact on elementary or middle-school buildings.

Bruce said costs for construction were

likely to temper any enthusiasm for consolidation, given the state's budget crunch.

State education officials say Kansas has averaged one to three consolidations a because a district was unable to survive financially or provide enough education opportunities.

Interim Education Commissioner Diane DeBacker said any document that lists districts that should consider consolidating isn't helpful for schools worried about their futures.

"This will make districts more nervous

than they already are now," DeBacker said. The last major study on consolidation was conducted in 2001.

Bruce said he would be meeting with the year over the past decade. Most happened leaders of other legislative committees to discuss the recommendations, adding that more incentives for voluntary consolidation might be worth pursing.

To encourage districts to consolidate, the Legislature agrees not to reducing their money until the merger is complete. Mergers often result in a loss of state aid based on enrollment and overall district property valuation.

judge found a subpoenaed newspaper reporter in contempt and fined day, insisting the company did her \$1,000 a day after she failed to show up to testify Wednesday about a jailhouse interview and her confidential sources in a murder investigation.

District Judge Daniel Love ordered Dodge City Daily Globe reporter Claire O'Brien to appear Friday at a rescheduled inquisition ests from the start of inquisition \ the Kansas equivalent of a grand jury.

A distraught O'Brien told the Associated Press the newspaper's owners made it "absolutely clear" that the publication would not pay for her legal help unless she testifies.

She said the corporate lawyers also blocked her attempts to get free legal assistance through the Reporters Committee for Freedom a different course of action this of the Press.

"I feel profoundly betrayed," she said. "I have been prepared to take one of the most difficult steps a citizen can take and I haven't been given the dignity of representation ... to facilitate my choice.

"I have been told that I have to betray my sources in order to get legal help.

O'Brien's claims late Wednesnot try to force her to testify in exchange for legal help, and that the company actually encouraged the Reporter's Committee to help O'Brien.

Earlier, the company issued a statement saying it had vigorously defended O'Brien's legal interproceedings through the Kansas Supreme Court's "regrettable decision" not to toss out the subpoe-

Stephen Wade, group publisher for GateHouse Media Kansas, also said the company had paid for a lawyer who worked for O'Brien before the reporter fired the lawyer Wednesday.

"Ms. O'Brien decided to pursue morning, so GateHouse's involvement in the legal proceedings has by her choice - ended," the company said in the statement.

the way." The unexpected turn in the case dismayed officials at the Kansas Press Association, who have said O'Brien's case illustrates the need for Kansas to join 35 other states in passing a "shield law" to protect reporters.

"We certainly believe the reporter has the right to protect her sources," said KPA executive director Doug Anstaett, "but she could have done that by appearing in court and refusing to testify. Her decision not to appear is one that we can't agree with.

The judge did not return a call from the AP seeking comment.

At the heart of the subpoena is an Oct. 13 Daily Globe story based on O'Brien's jailhouse interview with Sam Bonilla, who has been charged with second-degree murder and attempted murder in a Labor Day shooting.

Bonilla, who is Hispanic, reportedly told O'Brien that he acted in self-defense after the two victims, both white, tried to run him down while he was jogging with two children along the Arkansas River. The story suggested that the incident had stirred up anti-Hispanic sentiment.
