


Weather Corner

responsibility, phone skills, how to practice tolerance, and a long list of important commonly known skills.

"The students actually look forward to the days we talk about everyday life lessons," Henry said, "and are amazed at what they learn."

"For instance, most of them did not know it is rude to talk on a cell phone while on a date. They didn't know why they needed to know how to sew on a button. I told them their mother would not always be around to sew it on for them, and they had never thought of that!"

Henry said she made a list of 26 lessons on life, enough to have a classroom session every two weeks.

The kids are learning that it's important to acknowledge people in public because people instinctively like others who appear friendly and confident, and that the habit of saying "hi" can help them to be more successful in high school, college and in their careers.

A big lesson in etiquette is coming with a planned formal dinner.

"One of the teachers has volunteered to loan her table setting for 24," Henry said, "and some of the mothers will cook, so the students will be learning formal dining eti-

quette. They will dress up for the day, and we are all looking forward to that."

Word of the class has spread around the school, she said.

"I have actually had students who are not in this class come and ask me questions on some of the lessons," the teacher said.

Henry said she took the life lessons a little further with a lesson on how to give back.

The class opened a concession stand at one of the high school activities, she said, and made about \$300.

"So we divided the class into three groups and each group had a little over \$30 to spend," she said. "They got to choose a

charity they wanted to give to. They estimated what they could buy with the money. They did an excellent job of estimating how much the \$30 would buy, and not one group went over their given amount.

"We all went shopping together. One group chose from the Angel Tree at Walmart, one chose Genesis and the other group chose Puddle Duck (Preschool). The school provided a bus to take us to do the shopping, and when we were done, the students took their gifts to be put under the tree at the Methodist Church, and got to see what they were giving to."

"It was a great experience. The act of giving back was very satisfying to them."

Legislature nears halfway point

TOPEKA (AP) — Kansas legislators are approaching the first major deadline of the 2010 session with many of the major issues still unresolved.

Saturday is the deadline for

most bills to be approved by their chamber of origin or be lost for the year. Exceptions are made for legislation on the budget, taxes or state and federal affairs.

The House and Senate have both

passed bills trimming this year's budget by about \$90 million. Once any differences are worked out by negotiators, the chambers will vote on a final compromise version.

Lawmakers will then turn to writing the budget for the fiscal year that starts July 1. The state is already facing a projected deficit of \$416 million for that budget year.




Giersch, walked away with high point in the Precision Jazz routine in the 8-10-year-old division at last years event.
