# SuperCroc exhibit opening at Sternberg

"The Science of SuperCroc" exhibit, until now seen only in Chicago, Cincinnati and the Netherlands, will open at Fort Hays State University's Sternberg Museum of Natural History on Saturday. Museum officials and a three-person crew from Project Exploration, the exhibit's owner, are installing the exhibit, which arrived in three semi-trailer loads.

The exhibit, which has as its the 40-foot-long centerpiece crocodile, will be here until Aug. 5. It also includes the actual fossil skull of the SuperCroc, a copy of the 6-foot-long skull for photo opportunities, and an interactive skeleton of the crocodile-mimic dinosaur, Suchomimus (pronounced SUE-koh-MY-mus).




