1) Downsize the Legislature — The permanent method to reduce legislative costs!

• Place on the 2010 statewide ballot a proposition to downsize the Legislature by 30 percent. If approved by the people (you know they will), the 2012 election will deciding who gets to sit and who's

• Reduce Legislature to 30 Senators and 90 Representatives. This will save \$1.8 million.
