# Atwood soldier returns from duty

Army Spec. Alex F. Bebb has returned to Fort Richardson in Anchorage, Alaska, after being deployed to Afghanistan for a year. He is one of 3,500 members of the 4th Airborne Brigade Combat Team, 25th Infantry Division stationed at the fort.

Bebb is the son of Marlene K. and Dean R. Bebb of Atwood and a 2008 graduate of Rawlins County High School.

The airborne brigade served in the Paktya, Paktika and Khost provinces of eastern Afghanistan. Some of the challenges the brigade soldiers faced included poverty, unemployment, security and

management of natural resources and government institutions. Soldiers improved roads, provided vocational training in construction and civics, improved and re-opened 29 schools, remodeled six medical clinics and improved three district courthouses.

While deployed in Afghanistan, Bebb was decorated with the Army Commendation Medal, and promoted to specialist.

Bebb, an intelligence analyst, is assigned to the 3rd Battalion, 509th Parachute Infantry Regiment. He has two years of military service.

## Vegetable gardens popular

The hottest outdoor trend among U.S. households appears to be one that initially dwindled and died out decades ago – vegetable gardens.

And, Kansas State University is primed to help everyone from novice to experienced food-crop growers. K-State Research and Extension has just released an updated, expanded and “greener” version of its long-time classic for fans of homegrown vegetables and herbs, the “Kansas Garden Guide.”

The new 80-page edition is available at no cost on the Web, either as an Internet reference or pdf download. That version is at [www.ksre.ksu.edu/library/hort/2/S51.aspx](http://www.ksre.ksu.edu/library/hort/2/S51.aspx).

The same Web page includes a link for those who'd prefer to order a high-quality printed copy for

\$5.30, plus tax and shipping. Kansans can instead ask their county or district Extension office to submit an order.

The guide is in everyday language, illustrated with color photographs. It also features charts and graphs that make wide arrays of information easy to understand, compare and use – including tools and supplies, optimum Ph range, water-holding capacity, alternative pest controls, vegetable storage, and when to plant and harvest.

The publication has directions on making and using compost. It explains how to conserve time and water and how to take a soil sample. It has a chapter on growing food crops in patio pots.

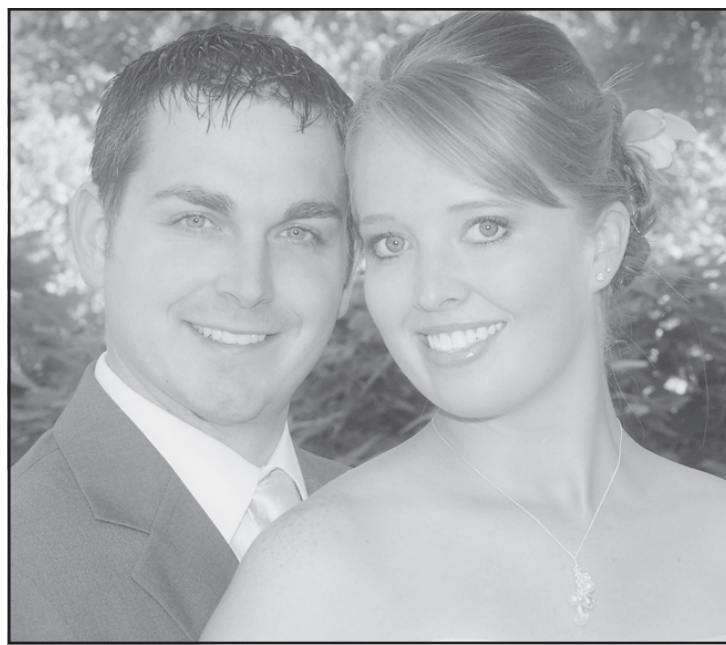
In addition, the guide has sections about vegetables and herbs likely to perform well in Kansas and the related pests.
