

Two Brewster runners take first at Cheylin meet

The Brewster Junior High track team travelled to Bird City for the Cheylin Invitational on Friday, March 26.

The eighth-grade girls took fifth overall.

Maddie Mayer won the 800-meter run with a time of 3 minutes, 4.93 seconds; placed third in the long jump with a leap of 11 feet, 5 inches; and took fourth in the triple jump.

Alicia Barrie took fourth in the discus with a toss of 53 feet, 2 inches. Michelle Herz finished fifth in the long jump with 9' 11". Both 4-by-200 medley relay teams took fourth, while the 4-by-100 relay team brought home second. The sixth- and seventh-grade

girls' took sixth.

Krystal Lowe took third in the discus with a toss of 50 feet, 11 inches. Kat Boyington took fifth in the shot put with 22' 7". Dara Roulter threw the softball 105 feet, 6 inches for second.

Kyndra Rush finished fifth in the 800-meter run with 3:19.06. Brielle McKee snared sixth in the long jump and fifth in the 100-meter dash. The 4-by-100-meter and medley relay teams both took third.

The eighth grade boys snared third.

Nathan Jorgensen had a great meet, taking third in the shot put with 34' 5", fifth in the discus with 89', and running the 100 in 13.79 to take third. The medley relay team took second, and the 4-by-100-meter relay team finished fourth.

The seventh-grade boys took fourth.

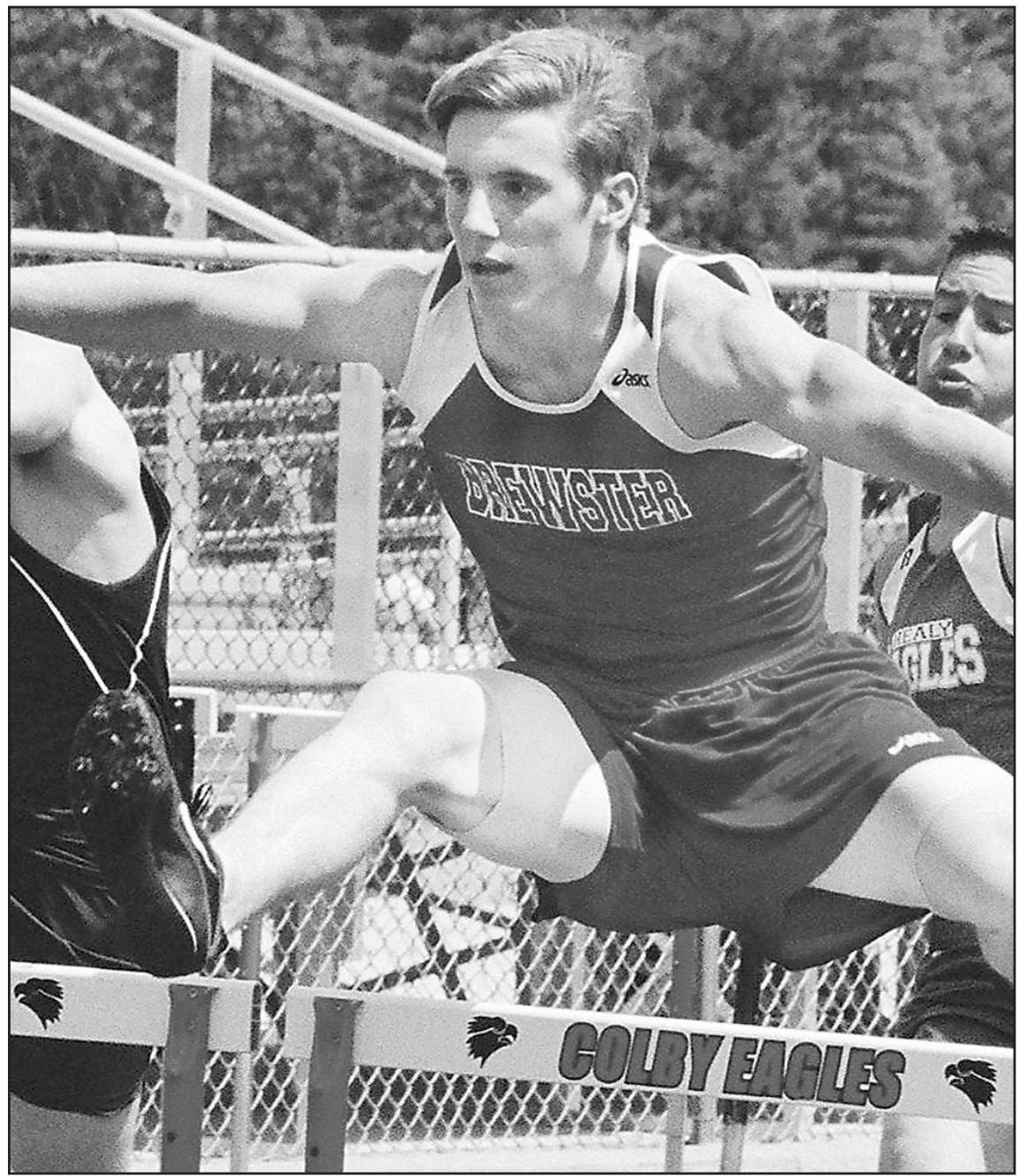
Jace Jorgensen brought home the gold, winning the 75-meter hurdles in 14.69 seconds. He snared fifth in the long jump with 11' 11". C.J. Felzien threw the discus 65' 11" for third.

Takoda Turner was second in the shot put with 26' 10" and the 800-meter run with 2:57.59. Carl Mayer finished fourth in the softball throw with 133' 5".

Layton Werth ran the 1,600 meters in 6:32.93, taking second. He was fifth in the 800 meters. Justin Schmidt took sixth in the 1,600 meters with 7:01.04.

The 4x100 relay team took second, and the medley relay team was sixth.

The junior high will compete again at 10 p.m. Saturday in Goodland.

Denver Broncos trade receiver for second-round draft picks

ENGLEWOOD, Colo. (AP) — The Denver Broncos traded wide receiver Brandon Marshall to the Miami Dolphins for a second-round pick in next week's draft and a second-rounder in 2011.

Marshall will fly to Miami later Wednesday for a physical, after which he is expected to sign a long-term contract that he's been seeking for over a year.

Marshall has long wanted out of Denver, and got his wish when the Broncos pulled off their second blockbuster deal in as many seasons under coach Josh McDaniels. Denver sent quarterback Jay Cutler to Chicago last April for Kyle Orton and draft picks.

Marshall's four-year stint in Denver was filled with fantastic plays but also plenty of frustration.

He posted his third consecutive 100-catch season last year and made his second straight trip to the Pro Bowl despite several run-ins with McDaniels both on and off the field. He was suspended for insubordination in training camp and again for the season finale after he was tardy for treatment on a hamstring injury the team felt he was exaggerating.

Still, Marshall caught 101 passes last season, including an NFL-record 21 in a loss at Indianapolis, for 1,120 yards. His 10 touchdowns were a career best.

Miami is a surprise destination for Marshall because Dolphins coach Tony Sparano hadn't shown much interest in acquiring him. But football czar Bill Parcells, who has final say on personnel matters in Miami, has never shied away from talented-but-troubled wide receivers, working with Terry Glenn in New England, Keyshawn Johnson in New York and Terrell Owens in Dallas.

Marshall, who has 327 career catches for 4,019 yards and 25 touchdowns in four seasons, represents the biggest trade acquisition by the Dolphins since running back Ricky Williams went to Miami in 2002 for four draft picks, including two first-rounders.

The trade also shakes things up in the AFC East, where the New York Jets acquired another talented but troubled wide receiver in Santonio Holmes from the Pittsburgh Steelers on Sunday in exchange for a fifth-round pick in this year's draft.

The Dolphins have been desperate for a deep threat at receiver to loosen up defenses for their potentially potent ground game and young, strong-armed quarterback Chad Henne.

Speedy Ted Ginn Jr. has been a disappointment since Miami took him with the ninth overall draft pick in 2007.

Competing in his first high school meet, freshman Michael Schmidt took second in the 1,600-meter run with 5:21.74, and fifth in the 3,200 with 12:13.21. Also running for the Bulldogs were freshmen Dan Brown and Ben Baird and junior Gustavo Ribeiro.

For the Bulldog girls, sophomore Kasey Hoyt snared second in the 800-meter run with 2:47.98 and the 1,600 with 6:30.79. Also competing were junior Sheena Rall and freshmen Jasmine Staten and Amber Barrie.

The Bulldogs will compete next at 3 p.m. on Friday, April 23, at Oakley.
