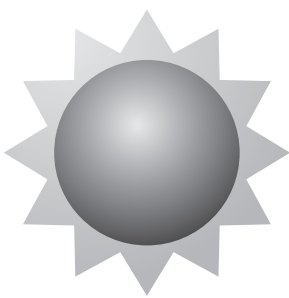


Weather Corner

Software transition still slow for county staff

modification request to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment for the household hazardous waste facility to accept items from "small-quantity" users, including homes and small businesses. In the past, the landfill could not accept business waste as household waste.

He said the landfill wants approval to apply latex paint that cannot be used elsewhere to the working face of the pit. If approved, the paint will be mixed with topcoat cover and applied using the county's applicator.

Otherwise, he said, the county has to pay Clean Harbors, a commercial recycler and disposal firm, to take the paint. If approved,

this will save the county disposal fees.

He said the Stinson Group has resubmitted estimates on the cost of using water balance, using different layers of permeable materials, as an alternative final cover for finished cells. The firm estimated \$20,000 engineering costs for testing the water-balance cover, saving about \$100,000 if the landfill employees do the dirt work versus bringing in a contractor. The landfill is also working with Milco, an affiliate of Miller, and the state on a "performance-based" closing procedure, he said.

Jumper said he will report back to the commissioners on progress with both.

Road Supervisor Clair Schrock told the commissioners he is preparing a request for sealed bids to replace one county pickup

and the 1994 Chevrolet 3500 service truck. He said they have put over \$6,000 into the one truck since the first of the year, and it needs to be replaced.

He told the commissioners his crew is working on County Road 465, known as the Campus Road, which draws a lot of trucks heading to the alcohol plant east of Oakley. They are ripping up the road, mixing the dirt with a stabilizing chemical, pushing it into windrows, then blading it back onto the surface, and packing it with both "sheep's-foot" and rubber-tire packers.

Schrock said he is pretty impressed with the outcome.

In other business, commissioners:
• Agreed an invoice from CB Heating and Air Conditioning for \$1,708 for installation

of a 40-gallon Rheem natural gas water heater and the removal of two old heaters at the Thomas County Office Complex would be paid out of the complex's building maintenance fund.

• Agreed to review heating and air conditioning proposals for the courthouse submitted by Tatro Plumbing Co., CB Heating and Air Conditioning, and PM Contracting Inc, and to discuss them at the meeting Monday.

• Decided to hold off paying a \$679 bill from the City of Colby for the Tax Increment Finance District so Commissioner Paul Steel could find out why the county is being charged.

• Approved a proclamation of April as Fair Housing Month.

When Brock first moved there,

he worked on glacier and whale-watching boats, where his job was always in jeopardy because of his picture taking. He has also lived in Denali National Park, Juneau, Fairbanks, Whittier and Seward.

actually experienced the disease — or knew some one who did.

Rotary members will not be replacing the deejays, said radio station manager, Sacha Sanguinetti, as the programming will be pretty much the normal program style.

Rotarians will be at the station during the day to man the phones to receive pledges.

Galli said that since 1988, the world has seen a 99 percent reduction of the disease, with very few countries left where children are at risk. India, Pakistan, Afghani-

stan and some African countries are targeted for help.

Following 20 years of hard work, the push to offer immunizations to developing countries is a window of opportunity of historic proportions, the organization says.

The club urges people to mark Thursday on their calendar, turn to 790 AM and share in the push to help end polio.
