God used sinner as great advocate

Saul of Tarsus, also known as the Apostle Paul, was a most amazing man. A study of Saul reveals that he was a persecutor of Christians; Saul was a very learned Torah scholar and believed the Christians to be a

destructive influence on God's chosen people, Israel.

Saul lived during the early formation of the Christian church and during a time when disciples of Christ were increasing greatly in number. The young man Saul saw this as a major threat to the Jewish faith. To that end he participated in the stoning of one of the first Christian martyrs, Stephen, by watching the coats of those stoning Stephen.

This is how the book of Acts describes the scene in the New International Version:

"But Stephen, full of the Holy Spirit, looked up to heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God. 'Look,' he said, 'I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.'

"At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices; they all rushed at him, dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their clothes at the feet of a young man named Saul. And Saul was there, giving approval to his (Stephens') death." (Acts

After Stephen was killed, Saul spearheaded the first persecution of the church:

"On that day a great persecution broke out against the church at Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria. Godly men buried Stephen and mourned Him. deeply for him. But Saul began to destroy the church. Going from house to house, he dragged off men and women and put them in prison." (Acts 8:1b-3)

"Saul was ... breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples. He went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues in Damascus, so that if he found any there who belonged to the Way, whether men or women, he might take them as prisoners to Jerusalem.

"As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me'

"'Who are you, Lord?' Saul

"'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting,' he replied. 'Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." (Acts

Saul of Tarsus, better known to us as Paul, the apostle of the gentiles, began as a persecutor of the church and ended up as its greatest missionary. The actions of Saul were then and would be considered today as a great sin against God, yet God used a great sinner to champion his cause of saving the gentiles.

It seems that the death of Jesus was for everyone, even as Paul would later describe himself, the worst of sinners. And the benefits of His sacrifice are available to any sinner who will receive him. That's a good thing, because there is not one of us who doesn't need
