The 53 students at the national competition in Indianapolis, he said, were the cream of the crop, with one each representing every state, Puerto Rico, the District of Columbia and a military dependent from France.

Henry said he got beat out in the quarter finals, but the experience was phenomenal.

"The people I met were the best part of it all," he said. They all had the same interests that I have."

He could have used some more scholarship money, since he will be leaving Aug. 30 for Columbia University in New York. He said the biggest reason he chose Columbia is because the core curriculum there is arts and humanities. He said he hopes to pursue a career in politics, law or the per-

forming arts.

In the meantime, Henry is putting the finishing touches to a humorous solo by Ray Romano for the state forensics tournament in Topeka on Saturday. He will also partner with Brock Wagoner in improvised acting.

Henry said his plans for the summer include doing "something he really enjoys," spending time at the Hugh O'Brian Leadership Conference in Wichita. Offered to high school sophomores, it is considered to be the best youth leadership conference in the country. He attended as a sophomore and was asked to come back as a junior staff member.

"I've been a junior staff member for the past two years," Henry said, "and it's something I'm really looking forward to."

Shadwick, a former member of the Salina city commission, said he mostly wants to listen to what people think, and what he's hearing is a general frustration with government. Dissatisfaction with the national health-care legislation was just the latest example, he said.

Shadwick said he never would have supported the health-care bill, but agreed that the what we have today wouldn't do. Health care is too hard to get and too expensive, he said. Shadwick would support allowing insurance plans to cross state lines and allowing individuals to form pools to get better coverage.

"That's a business way to attack the problem," he said. Shadwick said the problems in Washington are caused by both Democrats and Republicans. One example he points to is the national debt, which has grown by trillions upon both parties.

"If we get the same old Republican's back in charge, what's going to happen?" he asked.

Shadwick describes Washington

as having a "corruptive culture," where both parties have become addicted to spending, regardless of what individual members believed when they were elected. Shadwick said he wants to curtail that by instituting term limits.

"The founders would never have envisioned being in office for 50 years," he said.

Legislators are constantly in re-election mode, he said, which leaves little time for governing.

"They should be coming home for marching orders, not to raise funds," he said.

Shadwick said he would also advocate earmark reform.

"That's where votes are traded," he said. "That's where simple bills are made complicated."

Shadwick said not only would he not attach "pork-barrel" projects to bills, but he would also try to make sure that amendments having nothing to do with the subject of a bill are stripped off.

Trucking firms recognized

Two area firms were among professional truck drivers and their employers recognized by the Kansas Motor Carriers Association for their commitment to safety April 20 in Topeka.

Jim Mitten Trucking of Oakley and Short and Son of Goodland were among the fleet safety contest winners. Entrants accumulated 120 million miles travelled on Kansas highways in 2009 with an accident ratio of .40 per million miles, a 20 percent reduction from 2008.

Representing over 376 years of experience and more than 41 million miles of safe driving during their careers, 12 drivers were chosen as drivers of

the month.

ABF Freight Systems was the overall Fleet Safety Contest award winner, having lowered its accident ratio by 62 percent from 2008 to 2009. ABF trucks traveled 7.8 million miles in Kansas and had an accident ratio of .13 accidents per million miles.

This annual ceremony recognizes drivers and their companies for commitment to safety. Winners are selected by judges from the Kansas Highway Patrol, Kansas Corporation Commission and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration.

bine runs, what it can be used for and how to measure its productivity, Kaaz said. He added that Davis had gotten a Board of Regents Technology Grant that will allow the school to put up solar panels.

He said the college hopes to get the panels installed by June.

President Dr. Lynn Kreider said requiring students to have laptops was under discussion. Thomasson said he was developing an online course called Communications Technology for Professionals that

will teach people the basics of communications technology. He said one of the things students will be learning is how to download an audio program to an iPod. He said he taught the course in the classroom last fall, but now plans to turn it into an online course.
