"We ran a help-wanted ad for five weeks, and not one person applied," he added.

Merryman said at the rate they are going, the three employees will have to work for the county nine years, before reaching the \$12 an hour fig-

One employee spoke up and said a lot of them have second jobs, because the county wage isn't enough to live on.

Commissioner Paul Steele said he thought the employees were the most important asset the county has, and maybe they should spend more on employees and less on equipment, and they might have to defer some of the planned new equipment purchases.

"We find ourselves trying to figure out how to finance what we're doing and how to keep the doors open," said Commissioner Sowers.

The commissioners reminded the group that part of the sheriff's budget from last year wasn't spent, and that some of his revenue came from the drug forfeiture fund, and wasn't taxpayer money.

Chairman Christiansen told the group he was

glad they had a chance to visit and appreciated the demeanor of the meeting, and he thought there should be some way they could make the changes click. He promised the group of employees the commissioners would take a look at it and try to have some answers by next week, but that they couldn't get into a salary discussion at every meet-

Seven employees and board members from the Thomas County Soil Conservation District came to the commissioners to ask for continued support when they were making out the 2011 budget. They said their request for funding is less than the request two years ago, because they have cut down on salaries and wages.

"For every dollar you've put in we have had eight to nine thousand dollars return on the investment," said Jon Starns, a 20 year member of the county conservation board.

The board is asking for \$35,000 from the county budget for the coming year.

The commissioners commended the board and staff on their efforts to educate the youth of the area about preserving our natural resources, and promised to do what they can when it comes bud-

cent through June 2013, then drop to 5.7 percent, with some of the remaining revenues diverted to highway projects.

Democrats and moderate Republicans in both chambers had agreed with Parkinson that additional reductions would be crippling. They drafted both the proposed budget and the bill raising Republicans argued that raising taxes wasn't necessary, would hurt working families and would keep the state's economy in a recession longer.

House GOP leaders, conservatives who opposed raising taxes, in hopes of switching votes back. said the potential damage to schools and government programs by other Republicans that supportwas greatly overstated by supporters of a tax increase.

"I think we're taxed enough," said Rep. Joe Patton, a Topeka Republican. "In this debate, the ing continued. The last to switch taxpayer has become the forgotten person."

The closeness of the House reflected some Republicans' struggle with raising taxes.

"The moderate Republicans that voted for the budget and the revenue package did the state an enormous favor," Parkinson said.

The tax bill initially appeared to be failing Monday night, but supporters forced the House to keep the voting open and wait for missing members to return. That gave the bill's backers a chance to work on colleagues by phone.
