Colby College Lady Trojans' coach Brady Jasper has signed five freshman from Kansas for the 2010-2011 season. He has also signed two returning sophomores and a sophomore who didn't play last season.

Sophomores Hannah Thornton and Crystal Kinderknecht have agreed to return for another season. Thornton, a 6 foot, 1 inch forward from Dublin, Ireland, averaged 15 points and 8 rebounds per game for the Lady Trojans, but missed 12 games due to an injury. Kinderknecht averaged almost 4 points and 5.4 rebounds. She played in 29 games and was second on the team in steals with 27.

Brittany Schamberger, a 5 foot, 11 inch forward from Hoxie, sat out this past year. She averaged 11 points and six rebounds in her 2008-2009 season at Hoxie High.

Kee, a 5 foot, 9 inch forward from Beloit, averaged 10 points, 8 rebounds and 2 assists at St. John's Catholic High this year season. She was a Pike Trail All-League team selection all four high school years, making the all-league first team in three of those years.




