## Summertime is coming

This year middle school students' theme is "Make Waves at Your Library" (grades six through eight). At 10:15 a.m. Thursday mornings, they can participate in "Readers Theater" and then "Rock the Boat and Set Sail" at 3:15 p.m.

First through fifth grade students can attend "Water Rats" at 3:15 p.m. on Tuesdays or "High Seas Hijinks" at 3:15 p.m. on Wednesdays.

Preschool children - "Lil' Skippers" - can attend on Tuesdays if they are ages 3 to 5 years old, and Wednesdays if they are 18 months to 3 years old, at 10:15 a.m. both days

On Mondays and Fridays, the basement will be open for youth to enjoy using computers, the Wii, Playstation II, board games, puzzles and more.

On Mondays we will have special activities for the youth at 3:15 p.m. We will also have Family Time for the whole family on Thursday, June 10, and Thursday, July 8. The first special event will be held on the libraries east lawn on June 17.

We will have Tropical Shores Steel Drum Band performing for us on Thursday, June 17. On Thursday, June 24, we will have a comedy and magic show by Keir Royale in the basement.

Now to the books of the week. Today I would like to start with the biography, "Theodor Seuss Geisel" by Donald E. Pease. This book is published by Oxford Press and is part of their "Lives and Legacies Series. Pease explains in

the preface that he breaks up the person of Theodore Seuss Geisel into three personas: Ted, Geisel and Dr. Seuss (p. xi). This way he looks at him from the child, youth, and young adult (Ted); the mature man making the decisions (Geisel) and the creative person within and through his children's books (Dr. Seuss).

His origins in Springfield Mass., the large German community, enhanced his life. It is this place that he decided to write about. Seuss wanted to write fantasy and fiction about real places he knew. His first book "And To Think I Saw It On Mulberry Street" came from his home town experience. The biography discusses many of the books he wrote, and how they came about. Interspersed are cartoons and drawings. This book provides notes and a very nice index for the reader or researcher. If you are a Seuss enthusiast, you will enjoy this book and much of the trivia set within.

A second book is "Led by Faith: Rising from the Ashes of Rwanda Genocide," by Immaculée Ilibagiza with Steve Erwin. This is a captivating book about a nation of tribal cultures trying to live and heal after great atrocities. Immaculée's story is a real face-to-face conversation on daily decision making after living through the genocide. It shows us how importance forgiveness is even when it affects one's whole life. By making choices of forgiveness and love for both Hutus and Tutsis, she has been enabled by God to move beyond hopelessness, death and

destruction. She takes her problems, questions and hurts to God. A challenging story of love!

A third biography is "Larry King: My Remarkable Journey." Larry King writes about his life in this book and then allows others to fill in what they have experienced, think and feel about Larry. Larry states in the chapter entitled "My Remarkable Journey" how he often thinks he needs to pinch himself to believe the experiences and life he has had to date.

Known as Larry Zeiger prior to taking the last name King on the fly just prior to a radio show, he marvels at the influences he's made, the people he's interviewed, and friends in high places. All of this however, does not hold a candle to the experience of being a father. On a side note, Chapter 2 starts off with him telling how he was walking home carrying nine library books. He states he loved books even at nine years old! So for all you wannabe kids, who want to impact your world and become famous; read - and use your local library

The library will be having a large book sale from 9 a.m. to 7:45 p.m. next Thursday, 9 to 4:45 Friday, and 9 to 3:45 Saturday. We have some really neat resources for you to pick up at very low, low prices - books of all genres, VHS's, DVD's, cassette tapes, magazines, patterns, and more.

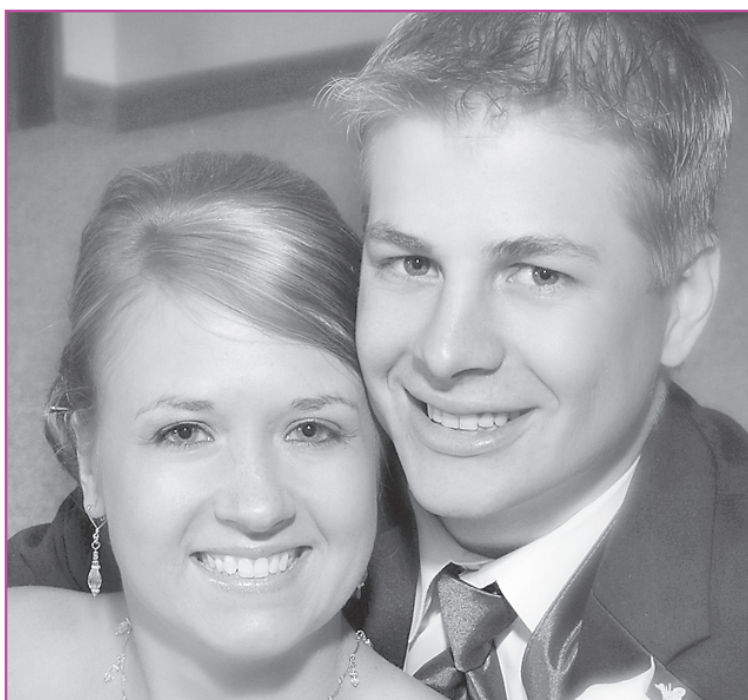
